W HEREAS the Time limited by His Ma-jefty's Order in Council of the Twentieth Day of June laft, prohibiting the transporting into any Parts out of this Kingdom, any Pig-Iron, Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rofin, Turpentine, An-chors, Cables, Cordage, Mafts, Yards, Bowfprits, Oars, Oakum, Oker, Sheet-Copper, or other Naval Stores, will expire upon the Twenty-fifth Day of this inflant December: And whereas it is judged exthis inftant December : And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majefty's Service, and the Safety of this Kingdom, that the faid. Prohibition fhould be continued for fome Time longer; His Majefty doth therefore, with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit, and com-mand, that no Perfon or Perfons whofoever do at any Time, for the Space of Six Months, to com-mence from the faid Twenty-fifth Day of this infant December, prefume to transport into any Parts tent December, pretime to transport into any Parts out of this Kingdom, any Pig-Iron, Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rofin, Turpentine, Anchors, Cables, Cordage, Mafts, Yards, Bowfprits, Oars, Oakum, Oker, Sheet-Copper, or other Naval Storeş, or fhip or lade any of the Articles above mentioned on board any Ship or Veffel, in order to transporting the fame into any Parts beyond the Serie without Leave or Permiffen being first the Seas, without Leave or Permiffion being first had and obtained from His Majefty or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring the Forfeitures inflicted by an Act passed in the Thirty-third Year of His Majefty's Reign, initialed, "An Act to cna-" the His Majefty to refer to the Europattion of Ma " ble His Majesty to restrain the Exportation of Na-" val Stores, and more effectually to prevent the Ex-" portation of Salt-Petre, Arms, and Ammunition, "when prohibited by Proclamation or Order in "Council." But it is, neverthelefs, His Majefty's Pleasure, that nothing herein contained shall ex-tend, or be construed to extend, to any of His Majefty's Ships of War, or any other Ships or Veffels or Boats, in the Scrvice of His Majefty, or em-ployed or freighted by His Majefty's Board of Ordnance, or by the Commiflioners of His Ma-

OU will be pleafed to acquaint their Lordships, that fince my Letter to you of the 8th Ultimo, Three French Privateers belonging to Guada-loupe have been captured and fent to this Ifland by His Majesty's Ships under my Command, as under mentioned.

By the Bittern, September 8th, off Marigalante, Le 10 Aout Brig, of Twelve Guns and Fifty Men; fhe had been cruizing on the American Coaft, where fhe had taken Three American Veffels, and One Dane, and was returning to Guadaloupe.

By the Matilda, the 5th Inflant, off the N. E. End of Antigua, L'Intrepid Brig, of Fourteen Guns and Seventy-four Men; had been out Three Days from Guadaloupe, without making any Captures.

By the Pearl, the 14th Inftant, off the East End of Antigua, the Scevola Sloop, of Ten Guns and Seventy-three Men; had been out Two Days and taken Nothing.

And the Pearl, a few Days previous to the laft-Capture, likewife destroyed a fmall French Privateer Row Boat, under Dominica.

I Erewith you will receive the Copy of a Letter from Rear-Admiral Lord Nelfon, incloing one from Captain Ball, of His Majefty's Ship Alex-

My Lord, Vanguard, at Sea, Nov. 1, 1798. Have the Honor to transmit you a Letter re-ceived from Captain Ball, dated October 30, together with the Capitulation of the Caftle of Goza, and a Lift of Ordnance, &c. found in it; the Prifoners are now embarked in the Vanguard and Minotaur 'till I can get a Veffel to fend them to France. Captain Ball, with Three Sail of the Line, a Frigate, and Fireship, is entrusted with the Block-ade of Malta, in which are Two Sail of the Line and Three Frigates ready for Sea; and from the ExperienceI have had of Captain Ball's Zeal, Activity, and Ability, I have no Doubt but that in due Time I shall have the Honor of fending you good Account of the French in the Town of Valetti.

SIR, ber, 30, 1798. Have the Honor to acquaint you, that the Com-mandant of the French Troops in the Caftle of Goza, figned the Capitulation the 28th Instant, which you had approved. I ordered Captain Cref-well, of the Marines, to take Possession of it in the Name of His Britannic Majefty, and His Majefty's Colours were hoisted. The next Day the Place was delivered up in Form to the Deputies of the Illand, His Sicilian Majefty's Colours holfted, and he acknowledged their lawful Sovereign.

I embarked Yefterday all the French Officers and Men who were on the Ifland of Goza, amounting to Two Hundred and Seventeen.

I inclose the Articles of Capitulation, and an Inventory of the Arms and Ammunition found in the Calle, Part of which I directed to be fent to the Affittance of the Maltefe, who are in Arms against the French. There were Three Thousand Two Hundred Sacks of Corn in the Castle, which will be a great Relief to the Inhabitants, who are much in Want of that Article.

ARTICLES of CAPITULATION

Between Alexander John Ball, Efq; Captain of His Britannic Majefly's Ship Alexander, appointed to condust the Blockade of Malta, under Rear-Admiral Sir Horatio Nelfon, K. B. on the Part of Great Britain, and Lieutenant-Colonel Lochey, Auj. de Batt. Commander of the French Troops in the Cafle of Goza.

THE French Troops shall march out of the Castle of Goza, with the Honours of War, I. " and shall lay down their Arms as they get out of the Gate.

II. The Castle of Goza, with all the Military Im-plements and Stores, shall be delivered up to the Britifh Officer appointed to take Charge of them.

III. The French Officers and Troops shall be protected in their Perfons and Effects, and the Officers allowed to retain their Side-Arms; they shall be em-barked immediately on board His Britannic Majesty's Ships, and fent to France in Transports, at the Ex-pence of the French Government. They are not to
