A T the Court at St. James's, the 26th of December, 1798, Sea Officers appointed to raife Men on Shore, or by the Captains or Commanders of any of His

PRESENT,

The KING's Moft Excellent Majefty in Council.

7 HEREAS His Majefty was gracioufly pleafed, by His Royal Proclamation bearing Date the Twenty-fixth Day of December, One thousand seven hundred and ninety-two, to promise and declare, that the Bounties of Five Pounds for every Able Seaman, and Two Pounds Ten Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, fit for His Majefty's Service, should be paid in the Manner thereby directed to every fuch Able and Ordinary Seaman, not above the Age of Fifty nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who should, on or before the Twenty-eighth Day of February then following, enter themselves to serve in His Majesty's Royal Navy, either with the Captains or Lieutenants of His Majefty's Ships or Veffels, or Officers employed on Shore for raifing Men for the Service of the Royal Navy : And whereas His Majefty was also graciously pleafed, by his faid Proclamation, to declare, that all Able-bodied Landmen, not above the Age of Thirty-five nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who should fo enter themselves as aforefaid, fhould receive the Sum of Thirty Shillings each Man, as His Majefty's Royal Bounty : And whereas His Majefty was also gracioufly pleafed, by His Royal Proclamation bearing Date the Sixteenth Day of the faid Month of February, One thousand seven hundred and ninety-three, to promise and declare, that a Reward of Twenty Shillings for every Able and Ordinary Seaman, fit to ferve on board His Majesty's Ships, should be paid to any Person who should discover any Seaman or Seamen who might conceal him or themfelves, fo that fuch Seaman or Seamen should be taken for His Majesty's Service, on or before the Thirtieth Day of April then next, by any of His Majefty's

by the Captains or Commanders of any of His Majefty's Ships or Veffels in the Ports or on the Coafts of this Kingdom : And whereas the Time limited by the faid Proclamations for Payment of the faid Bounties and Reward hath been prolonged and extended to the Thirty-first Day of this inftant December; and it being judged expedient for His Majesty's Service that the faid Bounties and Reward should be continued to be paid for some Time longer; His Majesty, with the Advice of His Privy Council, doth therefore order, and it is hereby accordingly ordered, that the Time, limited for the Payment of the faid Bounties and Reward be prolonged and extended, from the faid Thirty-first Day of this instant December to the Twenty-eighth Day of February next inclusive :---Whereof all Perfons concerned are to take Notice, and govern themfelves accordingly.

The KING's Molt Excellent Majelty in Council. WHEREAS it has been reprefented to His Majefty at this Board, that the malignant and infectious Difeafe of the Nature of the Plague, which fome Time fince manifested itself at Philadelphia, Bofton, and New York, has totally ceafed; His Majelty taking the fame into Confideration, and being defirous to remove all Restraints upon Trade, to far as may be confiftent with the Safety of His Subjects, is pleafed, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the Quarantine laid by His Majesty's Orders in Council, bearing Date the 29th of September and the 24th Days of October last respectively, upon all Ships, Veffels, Perfons, Goods, and Merchandize, arriving or to arrive from Philadelphia,
