W HEREAS His Majefty was gracioufly plcafed, by His Royal Proclamation bearing Date the Twenty-fixth Day of December, One thousand feven hundred and ninety-two, to promife and declare, that the Bounties of Five Pounds for every Able Seaman, and Two Pounds Ten Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, fit for His Majefty's Service, fhould be paid in the Manner thereby di-Service, fhould be paid in the Manner thereby di-rected to every fuch Able and Ordinary Seaman, not above the Age of Fifty nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who fhould, on or before the Twenty-eighth Day of February then following, enter themfelves to ferve in His Majefty's Royal Navy, either with the Captains or Lieutenants of His Majefty's Ships or Veffels, or Officers em-ployed on Shore for raifing Men for the Service of the Royal Navy: And whereas His Majefty was also gracioully pleafed, by his faid Proclamawas also gracioully pleafed, by his faid Proclama-tion, to declare, that all Able-bodied Landmen, not above the Age of Thirty-five nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who should fo enter themfelves as aforefaid, should receive the Sum of Thirty Shillings each Man, as His Majesty's Royal Bounty : And whereas His Majefty was also gracioufly pleafed, by His Royal Proclamation bearing Date the Sixteenth Day of the faid Month of February, One thoufand feven hundred and ninety-three, to promife and declare, that a Reward of Twenty Shillings for every Able and Ordinary Seaman, fit to ferve on board His Majefty's Ships, fhould be paid to any Perfon who fhould difcover any Seaman or Seamen who might conceal him or themfelves, fo that fuch Seaman or Seamen should be taken for His Majesty's Service, on or before the Thirtieth His Majeity's Service, on or before the Thirtieth Day of April then next, by any of His Majefty's Sca Officers appointed to raife Men on Shore, or by the Captains or Commanders of any of His Majefty's Ships or Veffels in the Ports or on the Coafts of this Kingdom: And whereas the Time limited by the faid Proclamations for Payment of the faid Bounties and Reward hath been prolonged and extended to the Thirty-first Day of this in-

T the Court at St. James's, the 26th of De- flant December; and it being judged expedient for cember, 1798, His Majefty's Service that the faid Bounties and Reward should be continued to be paid for fome Time longer; His Majesty, with the Advice of His Privy Council, doth therefore order, and it is hereby accordingly ordered, that the Time limited for the Payment of the faid Bounties and Reward be prolonged and extended, from the faid Thirty-first Day of this instant December to the Twenty-eighth Day of February next inclusive:-Whereof all Perfons concerned are to take Notice, and govern themfelves accordingly.

THEREAS it has been reprefented to His Majefty at this Board, that the malignant and infectious Difeafe of the Nature of the Plague, which fome Time fince manifested itself at Philadelphia, Bofton, and New York, has totally ceafed; His Majetty taking the fame into Confideration, and being defirous to remove all Reftraints upon Trade, fo far as may be confiftent with the Safety of His Subjects, is pleafed, by and with the Advice of His Subjects, is pleafed, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the Quarantine laid by His Majefty's Orders in Council, bearing Date the 28th of September and the 24th Days of October laft refpectively, upon all Ships, Veffels, Perfons, Goods, and Mer-chandize, arriving or to arrive from Philadelphia, or any Port within the State of Pennfylvania, or from Bofton and New York, or from any of the Ports within the Provinces of Maffachufets Bay and New York, be taken off: And that all fuch Ships and Veffels be permitted to difcharge their refpec-tire Ladings without unpacking, opening, and airing, and Veffels be permitted to dilcharge their refpec-tire Ladings without unpacking, opening, and airing, and without performing any Quarantine, as freely as they might have done in cafe luch Orders of the 28th of September and the 24th of October laft refpectively had not been made, any Thing in the faid Orders contained to the contrary notwithftand-ing. And the Right Honorable the Lords Com-millioners of His Majefty's Trealury, the Commitnoners for executing the Office of Lord High Ad-miral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Master General of the Ordnance, His Majefty's Secretary at War, and the Govern-ors or Commanders in Chief of the Ifles of Jerfey, Guernfey, Alderney, Sark, and Man, are to give the necessary Directions herein, as to them may refpectively appertain.

As foural Artificers and Manufadarers, Subjetts of Great Britain, have, from Time to Time, gone into Foreign Countries to exercife their feveral Callings, contrary to the Laws of thefe Kingdoms, the follow-ing Abflratts of Adds of Parliament of Their late Majeflies King George the First and Second, and of His prefent Majefly, for preventing such Pradices, are published, for the Information of all Perfons who may be ignorant of the Penalties they may incur by Disobedience to them: And it will be observed, that such Penalties likewise extend to those who are by Difobedience to them: And it will be objerved, that fuch Penalties likewife extend to those who are any ways concerned or instrumental in the Sending or Enticing Artificers or Manufacturers out of these Kingdoms, or in the Exportation of the Tools and Instruments used by them, as well as to the Artificers or Manufacturers themfelves.

Statute 5 George I. Chap. 27. IF any Perfon shall contract with, entice, or folicit, any Artificer in Wool, Iron, Steel, Brafs, or other Metal, Clock-maker, Watch-maker, or any other Artificer of Great Britain, to go into Foreign Countries out of the King's Dominions, and shall be convicted thereof, upon Indictment or Informa-tion in any of the Courts at Westminster, or at the Affizes or Quarter Schons, he fhall be fined any Sum not exceeding ONE HUNDRED POUNDS for the first Offence, and shall be imprisoned Three Months, and till the Fine be paid. And if any Per-fon having been once convicted shall offend again, he shall be fined at the Discretion of the Court, and imprifoned Twelve Months, and till the Fine be paid.

If any of the King's Subjects, being fuch Artificers, shall go into any Country out of His Majesty's Dominions, to exercise or teach the faid Trades to Foreigners; and if any of the King's Subjects in any fuch Foreign Country, exercifing any of the faid Trades, fhall not return into this Realm within Six Months after Warning given by the Ambaffador, Minilter or Conful of Great Britain, in the Country where fuch Artificers shall be, or by any Perfon authorifed by fuch Ambaffador, &c. or by one of the Secretaries of State, and from henceforth inhabit within this Realm; fuch Perfons fhall be incapable of taking any Legacy, or of being an Executor or Administrator, or of taking any Lands, &c. within this Kingdom, by Defcent, Devife, or Purchafe, and shall forfeit all Lands, Goods, &c. within this Kingdom, to His Majesty's Use, and shall be deemed Alien, and out of His Majefty's Protection.

Upon Complaint made, upon Oath, hefore any Juffice of Peace, that any Perfon is endeavouring to feduce any fuch Artificer, or that any fuch Artificer hath contracted or is preparing to go out of His Majesty's Dominions, for the Purposes aforefaid, fuch Justice may fend his Warrant to bring the Perfon complained of before him, or before fome other Juffice; and if it shall appear by the Oath of One Witnefs, or by Confession, that he was guilty of any of the faid Offences. fuch Justice may bind him to appear at the next Affizes or Quarter Sef-fions: And if fuch Perfon shall refuse to give Security, the Juffice may commit him to Gaol till the next Affizes or Quarter Seffions, and until he fhall be delivered by due Course of Law. And if any

fuch Artificer shall be convicted, upon Indicament, of any fuch Promife, Contract, or Preparation to go beyond the Seas, for the Purpole aforefaid, he shall give fuch Security to the King not to depart out of His Majefty's Dominions, as fuch Court shall think reasonable, and shall be imprisoned till Security given.

IF any Perfon shall contract with, or endeavour to feduce any Artificer in Wool, Mohair, Cot-ton, or Silk, or in Iron, Steel, Brafs, or other Metal, or any Clock-maker, Watch-maker, or any other Artificer in any other of the Manufactures of Great Britain or Ireland, to go out of this Kingdom or Ireland into any Foreign Coun-try not within the Dominions of the Crown of Great Britain, and fhall be convicted, upon Indictment or Information, in the King's Bench at dictment or Information, in the King's Dench at Weffminfter, or by Indictment at the Affizes or General Gaol Delivery for the County, &c. wherein fuch Offence fhall be committed in Eng-land, or by Indictment in the Court of Jufficiary or any of the Circuit Courts in Scotland, or by Indictment or Information in the King's Bench at Dublin, if fuch Offence be committed in Ireand Dublin, in rulei Onlinee be committee in re-land; the Perfon fo convicted fhall, for every Ar-tificer contracted with or feduced, forfeit FIVE HUNDRED POUNDS, and fhall fuffer Impri-fonment in the Common Gaol of the County or Stewartry wherein fuch Offender fhall be convicted for Twelve Calendar Months, and until Forfeiture be paid: And in cafe of a fubfequent Offence of the fame Kind, the Perfons fo again offending fhall forfeit, for every Perlon contracted with or feduced, ONE THOUSAND POUNDS, and shall suffer Imprisonment in the Common Gaol of the County or Stewartry wherein fuch Offender (hall be convicted, for Two Years, and until fuch Forfeiture be paid.

If any Perfon in Great Britain or Ireland shall put on board any Ship or Boat, not bound directly to fome Port in Great Britain or Ireland, or to fome other of the Dominions of the Crown of Great Britain, any fuch Tools or Utenfils as are commonly used in, or proper for the Preparing, Working up, or Finishing of the Woollen or Silk Manufactures, or any Part of fuch Tools, he shall, for every Of-fence, forfeit all such Tools, or Parts thereof, put fence, forfeit all fuch Tools, or Parts thereof, put on board, and TWO HUNDRED POUNDS, to be recovered by Action of Debt, &c. in any Court of Record at Weltminster, or in the Court of Seffion in Scotland, or at any of the Four Courts in Dublin refpectively, wherein no Effoin, &c. fhall be allowed.

It shall be lawful for any Officer of the Customs in Great Britain, or for any Officer of the Revenue in Ireland, to feize and fecure, in fome of His Majefty's Warehoufes, all fuch Tools or Utenfils pro-hibited to be exported, as fuch Officer fhall find on board any Vefiel not bound directly to fome Port in Great Britain or Ireland, or to fome other of the Dominions of the Crown of Great Britain ; and all Tools fo feized shall, after Condemnation, be pub-licly fold to the best Bidder; and one Moiety of

the Produce shall be to the Use of His Majesty, and the other Moiety to the Officer who shall feize and fecure the fame.

If the Captain of any Veffel in Great Britain or Ireland knowingly permit any of the faid Tools, prohibited to be exported, to be put on board his Veffel, he fhall, for every fuch Offence, forfeit ONE HUNDRED POUNDS, to be recovered as the Penalties inflicted upon Perfons exporting the Tools; and, if the Veficl belongs to His Ma-jeity, the Captain shall not only forfeit ONE HUNDRED POUNDS, but shall also forfeit his

Employment, and be incapable of any Employ-ment under His Majefty. If any Officer of the Cuftoms in Great Britain or of the Revenue in Ireland, take, or knowingly fuffer to be taken, any Entry outward, or fign any Cocket or Sufferance for the Shipping or Export-ing of any of the faid Tools, or knowingly fuffer the fame to be done, he shall forfeit ONE HUNDRED POUNDS, to be recovered as aforefaid, and alfo forfeit his Office, and be incapable of any Office under His Majefty.

One Moiety of the Forfeitures shall be applied to the Ufe of His Majesty, and the other Moiety to the Ufe of the Perfon who shall fue for the fame.

Statutes 14, 21, 25, and 26 of His prefent Majefly. BY these Statutes the like Penalties and Forfeitures as above-mentioned are extended to Perfons packing or putting on board any Veffel, not bound directly for fome Port in Great Britain or Ireland, any Machine, Engine, Tool, Prefs, Paper, Utenfil, or Implement whatfover, ufed in or proper for the working or finishing of the Cotton, Steel, or Iron Manufactures of this Kingdom, or any Part or Parts of fuch Machines or Implements, or any Models or Plans thereof; and all Captains of Ships and other Perfons receiving or being in Poffeffion of any fuch Articles, with an Intent to export the fame to Foreign Parts, and all Cultom-houfe Officers fuffering an Entry to be made thereof, are respectively liable to the like Penalties as are above-mentioned, in the cafe of Tools and Utenfils ufed in the Woollen and Silk Manufactures.
