SIR, Indefatigable, at Sea, Jan. 1, 1799. I Have the Pleafure to inform you, that at Dawn of Day, Yefterday Morning, Ufhant bearing N. E. Five Leagues, we captured the French Ship Privateer La Minerve, carrying Sixteen Guns and One Hundred and Forty Men, Twenty-eight Days from St. Malo. She was laying-to, waiting to proceed into Breft, and took this Ship for her Prize, the Afphalon, of Newcastle, from Halifax bound to London, laden with Sugar, Coffee, and Tobacco; which Ship we chafed all Day, and this Morning had the Satisfaction to retake off the Rocks of Albrevrak.

I have the Honor to inclose a Lift of Veffels captured by the Privateer during her Cruize.
