DLeafe to lay before my Lords Committioners of the Admiralty the accompanying Letter I have just received from Captain Fraser, of His Majesty's Ship Shannon, who has brought in a French Pri-vateer, out of Granville, mounting Eighteen Car-ronades and Two long Twelve-Pounders, and One Hundred and Twenty-five Men, which he captured on the 15th Instant.

Shannon, Cove of Cork, January 17, 1799.

I Beg Leare to acquaint you, that being on the Morning of the 15th Inftant in Latitude 49 Deg. 40 Min. and Longitude 9 Deg. 30 Min. W. with His Majefty's Ship under my Command, proceeding to the Rendezvous prefcribed by Captain Faulknor, I faw and, after a Chace of Seven Hours, captured Le Grand Indien, a Ship Privateer, from Granville, commanded by Gand Olivier Vubois, carrying Eighteen Brafs Carronades Eighteen-Pounders, and Two long Twelve-Pounders, manned with One Hundred and Twenty-five Men.

She was only Five Days from Granville, had taken nothing, is quite new, with Provisions and Stores for a Three Months Cruize.

From the Circumstance of the Prize having cargied her Main-maft by the Board while chafed, (and nificent, and juft, we feel confident that on she

as the Shannon allo iprung a Maintop-mail, and tore to Pieces Two Boats in fhifting Priloners,) the Wind blowing firong with a heavy Sea, I hope you will approve of my having accompanied her into Port.

#### To the KING's Most Excellent Majefiv.

May it pleafe your Majefly, W/E, your Majefly's most dutiful and loyal Sub-V jects, the Mayor, Sheriffs, Common-Council, and Commonalty of the City of Corke, in Court of D'Oyer Hundred affembled, beg Leave most humbly to approach your Majelly with Sentiments of the most affectionate Attachment to your Royal Perfon and Family, and the most confident Reliance on the Wildom and Firmnels of your Majefty's Government.

Whilft we contemplate, with the deepest Concern, the unprovoked Rebellion, which has lately dif-graced certain Quarters of this Kingdom, and the Treachery which invited a Foreign Enemy to its Shore, we cannot reprefs the Warmth of our Gratitude for the parental Anxiety manifested by your Majefty to protect us, and the prompt and affectionate Zeal with which our Silter Kingdom poured forth the Flower of her Nobility, and the most chosen of her Sons, to restore Quiet to the Land, and to repel our common and inveterate Foe.

We liften, with heartfelt Gratification, to any Meafure tending more clofely and indiffolubly to connect Two Countries, which feem relatively fituated for their mutual Support, and which none but the Enemies of each could ever with to divide.

Convinced that the most beneficial Effects must refult to the Empire at large from fuch a Connexion between this Kingdom and Great Britain as will terminate all Speculations on their separate Interefts, and afford additional Strength and Security to each by the cordial and energetic Co-operation of both ; we beg Leave most humbly to address your Ma-jefty as our common Parent, and to declare, that we hear with the utmost Satisfaction that an Union between the Two Kingdoms is at prefent within the Contemplation of your Majefty's Minifters: and as your Majefty's Difpolition towards your Kingdom of Ireland, has ever been gracious, anuΓ

W Hereas it has been humbly reprefented to His Majelty, That on Wednefday the 26th Day of December laft, between Ten and Eleven o' Clock at Night, Min Ambrofe Bowden, Sitter of the Cuftom-Houfe Boat stationed at Cawfand, within the Port of Plymouth, in the County of Devon, being out upon Duty with Four of his Men in his Boat, rowing from Cawfand Beach towards Penlee Point on the Coaft of Cornwall, in confequence of Information which he had received, that a Smuggling Veffel called the Lottery was about to land her Cargo near the faid Point, he difcovered a large Sloop or Cutter lying at Anchor, about Half a Mile from the Point, bearing S. W. by W. That on coming near to the faid Sloop or Cutter, Mr. Bowden perceived feveral Boats lying alongfide of

That on coming near to the faid Sloop or Cutter, Mr. Bowden perceived feweral Boats lying alongfide of ber and at ber Stern; and when he got within about One Hundred Yards of the faid Sloop or Cutter, fome Perfon on board called out and afked, What Boat that was? Upon which Mr. Bowden anfwered it was a King's Boat; upon which fome Perfon on board the Smuggling Sloop or Cutter, called out and faid, "Keep off, or I will fire into you." Mr. Bowden again faid, that his was a King's Boat, and a Revenue Boat, and dared the People on board to fire. That being by this Time within Twenty Yards of the Smuggling Sloop or Cutter, the People on board again ordered Mr. Bowden to keep off, and fired with Guns or Blunderbuffes at his Boat Three Times, by which Humphry Glinn One of Mr. Bowden's Men in the faid Boat, was killed:—That Mr. Bowden then took up a Mufket, which be bad in his Boat, and fired at the faid Sloop or Cutter feveral Times, upon which the People on board either cut or flipped their Cable, and failed away before the Wind to the Weftward, at the fame Time continuing to fire over her Stern at Mr. Bowden's Boat: That Mr. Bowden, not being able to purfue the faid Sloop or Cutter, returned to Cawfand Bay, where he swent on board of His Majefty's Ship Stag, and the Surgeon and his Mate examined the faid Humphry Glinn, when they found that the fore Part of his Skull was fbot away, and that the was quite dead.


