Our Will is therefore, and We charge, That this Our Proclamation feen, ye forthwith pafs to the Market Crofs of Edinburgh, and all other Places needful, and there, in Our Name and Authority, make Publication hereof, that none pretend Igno-rance: And Our Will and Pleafure is, That Our Solicitor do caufe printed Copies hereof to be fent to the Sheriffs of the feveral Shires, Stewarts of Stewartries, and Bailiffs of Regalities, and their Clerks, whom We ordain to fee the fame published ; and We appoint them to fend Copies hereof to the feveral Parish Churches within their Bounds, that upon the Lord's Day immediately preceding the Day above-mentioned, the fame may be published, and read from the Pulpits, immediately after Divine Service.

Extract of another Letter from the Earl of St. Vincent, K. B. Commander in Chief of His Majefly's Ships and Veffels in the Mediterranean, to Evan Nepean, Efq; dated at Gibraltar, the 23d December, 1798. SIR,

BY fome Accident Captain Middleton's Relation of the gallant Action performed by the Boats of His Majelty's Ship Flora, commanded by the First Lieutenant (Ruffel) of that Ship, in cutting out the Mondovi French Corvette, from Cerigo, was not transmitted to you; it is now inclosed. ST. VINCENT. I am, &c.

His Majefly's Ship Flora, off Cerigo, My Lord, Archipelago, May 14, 1798. [Aving chaced a French National Brig into HAving chaced a French INATIONAL Ding mice Cerigo, and finding it impracticable to fol-low in the Ship, from the narrow Entrance of the Situation of the Harbour, and the commanding Situation of the Forts; on the Evening following I fent the Boats of His Majesty's Ship, under the Command of Lieutenant Russell, with Officers as per Margin *, who volunteered their Services in a very handfome Manner, with fuch of the Ship's Company as chofe to go to cut her out, which they did in a very gallant Mauner, under a fevere Fire from the Forts, the Brig, and feveral Veffels in the Harbour. She proves to be Le Mondovi Brig Corvette, of Sixteen Guns, Twelve Brafs Six-Pounders, and Four Iron Twelve-Pounders, manned with Sixty-eight Men, commanded by Citizen Bonnevie, Lieutenant de Vaisseau, a new Venetian-built Brig, fails well, though not coppered, is well found, and in my Opinion fit for His Majesty's Service.

I cannot express to your Lordship the high Sense I have of the gallant Behaviour of Lieutenant Russel, and of the Officers and Men sent on this Service, which they effected with little Lofs, notwithstanding the Énemy were prepared to receive them. I have fent Lieutenant Brown to command them for the Time being, as I think it probable, during the Cruife, we may meet a Ship of equal Force, it will be proper to give Lieutenant Ruffel that Opportunity of Promotion, in cafe of Succefs, he fo highly merits on this Occasion, as well as many others, fince under my Command.

I beg Leave to acquaint your Lordship, that I anchored on the 11th Inftant at St. Nicholas, on the Island of Cerigo, and cut out a French Polacre Ship from under the Fort; she being in Ballast, I found it neceffary to fcuttle her, and have landed her Prifoners with Le Mondovi, on getting a pro-per Receipt for them from the Governor at Cerigo.

ST. VINCENT.

My Lord, *Caroline, Lifbon, Dec.* 15, 1798. THIS ferves to advife your Lordship, on the 4th Instant. P. M. Latitude as Data Inftant, P. M. Latitude 38 Deg. 45 Min. Longitude 12 Deg. I observed a strange Sail to Windward, but the Weather being hazy, and she at a great Distance, I could not form a perfect Idea of her being a Cruizer; and having at that Time the Charge of Two Prizes, with which I was on my Way to Lifbon, I, by Way of a Decoy, made a Signal for the fame to form a Line, taking care to keep the Caroline's Stern towards the Stranger; and I had the Satisfaction in a short Time to find the Stratagem fucceeded ; for the Cruizer (as fhe turned out) feeing I took no Notice of her, chaced me, and, as I before obferved, the Weather being hazy, she got within the superior failing of the Caroline before she discovered her Mistake; she, however, led me a Chace of Four Hours, in Conclusion of which I had the Satisfaction of fecuring her: She proves to be a French Brig Privateer; her Name La Serailleur, commanded by Captain Malbernac, out of Bourdeaux Fifty-fix Days; fhe mounts Ten Brafs Four-Pounders and Two Brafs Six-Pounders, her Complement was Eighty-two Men, but when captured had only Fifty-eight on board, the Reft being dispersed in Two Americans she had captured. Herewich enclose you, for the Information of my Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, a Let-ter from Captain Halfted, of His Majefty's Ship Phænix, who has captured and fent in here the Foudroyant, a French Privateer, of Bourdeaux.

SIR, Phanix, at Sea, Jan. 23, 1799. Have the Pleasure to inform you that His Majefty's Ship Phœnix, under my Command, captured this Day at Noon, in Latitude 48 Deg. 39 Min. N. Longitude 17 Deg. 28 Min. W. the Foudroyant French Privateer Ship, pierced for Twenty-four Guns, and mounting Twenty Twelves and Sixes ; the former Brafs, with One Hundred and Sixty Men.

Eight of the Guns were thrown overboard during the Chace, which lasted from Twelve last Night, in which we run upwards of One Hundred and Twenty Miles : the was launched at Bourdeaux about Three Months ago, and failed from thence on this Cruize Nine Weeks fince : fhe has made Three Captures, Two of them English and One American: she is coppered, and appears to be a most complete Veffel. And I have further to acquaint you, that His Majesty's Sloop Victorieuse, Captain Dickson, de-stroyed on the 10th Ultimo a French Privateer Schooner of Twelve Guns, which he found at Anchor at Rio Caribbe, on the Island of La Margaritta. The Conduct of Captain Dickson in per-forming this Service was highly fpirited, as the Privateer lay under the Protection of Two Batteries, One of Four and the other of Two Guns, which kept up a Fire on the Victorieule, who received but little Damage in her Mafts and Rigging, but had Two Men killed and Two wounded.

The Crew of the Privateer escaped on Shore.
