The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. WHEREAS His Majefty was gracioufly pleafed, by His Royal Proclamation bearing Date the Twenty-fixth Day of December, One thoufand feven hundred and ninety-two, to promife and declare, that the Bounties of Five Pounds for every Able Seaman, and Two Pounds Ten Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman. fit for His Maiofur's every Able Seaman, and Two Pounds Ten Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, fit for His Majefty's Service, fhould be paid in the Manner thereby di-rected to every fuch Able and Ordinary Seaman, not above the Age of Fifty nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who fhould, on or before the Twenty-eighth Day of February then following, enter themfelves to ferve in His Majefty's Royal Navy, either with the Captains or Lieutenants of His Majefty's Ships or Veffels, or Officers em-ployed on Shore for raifing Men for the Service of the Royal Navy: And whereas His Majefty was alfo gracioufly pleafed, by his faid Proclama-tion, to declare, that all Able-bodied Landmen, not above the Age of Thirty-five nor under the Age above the Age of Thirty-five nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who should so enter themselves as aforefaid, should receive the Sum of Thirty Shillings each Man, as His Majefty's Royal Bounty : And whereas His Majefty was also gracioufly pleafed, by His Royal Proclamation bearing Date the Sixteenth Day of the faid Month of February, One Sixteenth Day of the faid Month of February, One thouland feven hundred and ninety three, to promife and declare, that a Reward of Twenty Shillings for every Able and Ordinary Seaman, fit to ferve on board His Majefty's Ships, fhould be paid to any Perfon who fhould difcover any Seaman or Seamen who might conceal him or themfelves, fo that fuch Seaman or Seamen fhould be taken for His Majefty's Service, on or before the Thirtieth Day of April then next, by any of His Majefty's Sea Officers appointed to raile Men of Shore, or by the Captains or Commanders of any of His Majefty's Ships or Veffels in the Ports or on the Coafts of this Kingdom: And whereas the Time limited by the faid Proclamations for Payment of limited by the faid Proclamations for Payment of the faid Bounties and Reward hath been prolonged Room by the Two Junior Knights Companions, and extended to the Twenty-eighth Day of this in- 1 and conducted between them to the Sovereign, pre-

St. James's, Friday, March 1, 1799. Chapter of the Most Noble Order of the Garter A having been fummoned to meet this Day, the Knights Companions, in their Mantles and Collars, with the Officers of the Order hereafter mentioned, in their Mantles, Chains, and Badges, attended the Sovereign in his own Apartments, and, being called over by Garter, a Proceffion was made from thence to the Great Council Chamber in the following Order :

The Sovereign and Knights Companions being feated, the Chancellor fignified to the Chapter the Sovereign's Pleafure for filling up the vacant Stall in St. George's Chapel, at Windfor; and, as by the Statutes none but a Knight can be elected, Garter and Black Rod were fent to introduce Earl Spencer, who was knighted by the Sovereign with the Sword of State

The Knights Companions then proceeded to the Election, and the Suffrages being collected by the Chancellor, and prefented to the Sovereign, George John Earl Spencer was, by His Majelty's Com-mand, declared duly elected. His Lordhip was ceded by Garter (bearing the Enfigns of the Order | Thomas Billinghurft, Gents to be Cornet, vice Ste-on a Cushion) and Black Rod. venfon.

Garter prefenting the Garter to the Sovereign, His Majeffy delivered it to the Two Senior Knights Companions, who buckled it on his Lordfhip's Left Leg, the Chancellor pronouncing the Admonition.

Garter then prefented the Ribbon with the George to the Sovereign; and, his Lordhip kneeling, the Sovereign, with the Affiftance of the Two Senior Knights Companions, put it over his fhoulder; the Chancellor, in the mean Time, pronouncing the Admonition; and his Lordfhip having killed His Majefty's Hand, and feverally faluted the Knights prefent, withdrew.

Garter then calling over the Knights, a Proceffion was made back to His Majefty's Apartment, in the Order as before.
