A PROCLAMATION.

GEORGE R.

HEREAS We have Reason to apprehend that divers Perfons engaged in the Treafonable Conspiracy against Us in Our Kingdom of Ireland, which lately manifested itself in open Acts of Rebellion and War against Us in Our said Kingdom, have not abandoned their Treasonable Defigns against Us, and acting in concert with Our Foreign Enemies, are preparing to affift Our faid Enemies in an Invasion of Our Kingdoms, and for that Purpose are endeavouring to incite and stir up Rebellion and War against Us in this Kingdom; We have therefore thought it necessary for the Safety of Our Kingdoms, to prevent all Persons engaged in such Treasonable Designs from passing from Our faid Kingdom of Ireland into this Kingdom: and We do, for that Purpose, by and with the Advice of Our Privy Council, order, and do hereby strictly charge and command, That, from and after the Twentieth Day of March instant, no Person whatsoever be permitted to pass from Our faid Kingdom of Ireland into this Kingdom, except fuch Persons as shall be in Our Service, and actually fo employed, and fuch Persons as shall obtain a Passport for that Purpose from Our Lord Lieutenant of Our faid Kingdom of Ireland, his Chief or Under-Secretaries, the Mayor, or other Chief Magistrate, of some City or Town in Ireland, or One of Our General Officers commanding Our Forces within the feveral Districts in Our said Kingdom; and by and with the Advice aforefaid, We do further order, and hereby strictly charge and command, that no Person whatsoever, (except as aforesaid,) coming from Our said Kingdom of Ireland, be permitted to land in this Kingdom without Our Licence for that Purpose first obtained; and that all fuch Persons (except as aforesaid) who

shall land or attempt to land in this Kingdom, without such Licence as aforesaid, shall be forthwith taken into Custody, and detained in Custody until Our Pleasure shall be surther known; and We do surther order and require, that all Persons, having such Passports as aforesaid, shall produce the same to some Officer of Our Customs at the Port or Place to which such Persons shall come, before such Persons shall be permitted to land at such Port or Place; and We do hereby, by and with the Advice aforesaid, strictly enjoin, require, and command all and singular Justices of the Peace, Mayors, Sherists, Bailists, Constables, and all other Our Officers and Subjects, to use their utmost Endeavours for the due Execution of these Our Commands.

WHEREAS by an Act, passed in the Twentyeighth Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, intituled, "An Act for regulating the Trade

of between the Subjects of His Majesty's Colonies of and Plantations in North America, and in the 66 West India Islands, and the Countries belonging 66 to the United States of America, and between 44 His Majesty's said Subjects and the Foreign Islands in the West Indies," It is, amongst other Things, enacted, That it shall and may be lawful for His Majesty in Council, by Order or Orders to be issued and published from Time to Time, to authorize, or by Warrant or Warrants, under His Sign Manual, to empower the Governor of Newfoundland for the Time being to authorize, in case of Necessity, the Importation into Newfoundland of Bread, Flour, Indian Corn, and Live Stock, from any of the Territories belonging to the faid United States, for the Supply of the Inhabitants and Fishermen of the Island of Newfoundland, for the then ensuing Season only; provided always, that fuch Bread, Flour, Indian Corn, and Live Stock, fo authorized to be imported into the Island of Newfoundland, shall not be imported except in conformity to fuch Rules, Regulations, and Restrictions as shall be specified in such Order or Orders, Warrant or Warrants, respectively, and except by British Subjects and in British-built Ships, owned by His Majesty's Subjects, and navigated according to Law. And whereas it is expedient and necessary that Provision be made for fully supplying the Inhabitants and Fishermen of the Island of Newfoundland, for the enfuing Season, with Bread, Flour, Indian Corn, and Live Stock; His Majesty doth thereupon, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order and declare, That, for the Supply of the Inhabitants and Fishermen of the Island of Newfoundland, for the enfuing Seafon only, Bread, Flour, Indian Corn, and Live Stock may be imported into the faid Island from any of the Territories belonging to the faid United States, by British Subjects, and in British-built Ships, owned by His Majesty's Subjects, and navigated according to Law, and which shall, within the Space of Seven Months previous to the Time of such Importation, have cleared out from some Port in Great Britain, or fome other Part in His Majesty's Dominions in Europe, for which Purpose a Licence shall have been granted by the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs in England or Scotland, or the Commissioners of His Majesty's Revenue in Ireland, or any other Person or Persons who may be duly authorized in that Kingdom respectively, in she Manner and Form hereinafter mentioned; which Licence shall continue and be in Force for Seven Calendar Months from the Day of the Date upon which Such Licence is respectively granted, and no longer; provided that no fuch Licence as aforefaid, granted after the Thirtieth Day of September, One thousand seven hundred and ninety-nine, shall be of any Force or Effect: And His Majesty is hereby fur-

ther pleased to order, That the Master, or Person having the Charge or Command of any Ship or Vessel to whom such Licence shall be granted, shall, upon the Arrival of the faid Ship or Vessel at the Port, Harbour, or Place in the Island of Newfoundland, where he shall discharge such Bread, Flour, Indian Corn, and Live Stock, deliver up the faid Licence to the Collector or other proper Officer of the Customs there, having first indorsed on the Back of fuch Licence the Marks, Numbers, and Contents of each Package of Bread, Flour, or Indian Corn, and the Number of Live Stock, under the Penalty of the Forfeiture in the faid Act men-And the Collector or other proper Officer tioned. of the Customs of Newfoundland is hereby enjoined and required to give a Certificate to the Master, or Person having the Charge or Command of such Ship or Vessel, of his having received the said Licence, so indorfed as before directed, and to transmit the fame to the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs in England or Scotland, or to the Commissioners of His Majesty's Revenue in Ireland, respectively, by whom fuch Licence was granted. having the Charge or Command of the said Ship, is required and enjoined to deliver up the said Licence to the Collector or other proper Officer of His Majesty's Customs there, and to indorse on the Back thereof the Marks, Numbers, and Contents of each Package of Bread, Flour, or Indian Corn, and the Number of Live Stock, and shall thereupon receive a Certificate thereof from the said Collector or other proper Officer of the Customs.
