Annuity of Thirty Thousand Pounds per Annum, which His Majesty was enabled to fettle on their Royal Highnesses His Majesty's other Daughters, out of the Hereditary Revenues, by virtue of an Act passed in the Eighteenth Year of the Reign of His prefent Majesty.

An Act for extending the Time for returning Statements under an Act, paffed in the prefent Selfion of Parliament, intituled, "An Act to repeal the Duties imposed by an Act made in the last Seffion of Parliament for granting an Aid and Contribution for the Profecution of the War, and to make more effectual Provision for the like Purpofe, by granting certain Duties upon Income in lieu of the faid Duties," and to amend the faid Act:

An Act to amend and render more effectual Two Acts, passed in the Thirty-eighth Year of His prefent Majefty's Reign and the present Session of Parliament, for the Redemption and Purchase of the Land Tax.

An Act to continue, until the Twenty-fourth Day of June, One thoufand eight hundred, an Act made in the Twenty-ninth Year of the Reign of His late Majelly King George the Second, Chapter Fifteen, videlicet, on the Thirtcenth Day of November, One thoufand feven hundred and fifty-five, for granting a Bounty on certain Species of British and Irish Linens exported, and taking off the Duties on the Importation of Foreign Raw Linen Yarns made of Flax.

An Act for punishing Mutiny and Defertion, and for the better Payment of the Army and their Quarters.

An Act for the Regulation of His Majefty's Marine Forces while on Shore, until the Twentyfifth Day of March One thousand eight hundred.

An Act to continue, until the Twenty-fifth Day of May next, an Act made in the Thirty-ninth Year of the Reign of His prefent Majefty, Chapter Nine, videlicet, on the Fourth Day of January, One thousand seven hundred and ninety-nine, for continuing several Acts made in the thirty-fixth, and Thirty-feventh, and in the Thirty-eighth Years of the Reign of His prefent Majefty, for sufpending the Operation of certain Acts made in the Fisteenth and Seventeenth Years of the Reign of His prefent Majefty, for restraining the Negotiation of Promisfory Notes and Bills of Exchange, under a limited Sum, within that Part of Great Britain called England.

An Act to continue, until the Twenty-fifth Day of May next, an Act paffed in the Thirty-ninth Year of the Reign of His prefent Majefty, Chapter 'Ten,' videlicet, on the Fourth Day of January, One thousand feven hundred and ninety-nine, for continuing feveral Acts for allowing the Banks and certain Banking Companies in that Part of Great Britain called Scotland, to iffue Notes for Sums under a certain Amount.

An Act to continue, until the Twenty-fifth Day of March, One thousand eight hundred, an Act passed in the Session of Parliament holden in the Thirtyfixth and Thirty-feventh Years of His present Majesty, Chapter Seventy-fix, videlicet, on the Sixth Day of June, One thousand seven hundred and ninety-feven, for difallowing the Bounty on the Exportation to Ireland of Sail-cloth or Canvas of the Manufacture of Great Britain.

An Act to revive and continue, until the Twentyfifth Day of March, One thouland eight hundred, an Act pailed in the Seffion of Parliament of the Thirty-fixth and Thirty-feventh Years of His prefent Majefty, Chapter Seventy-two, videlicet, on the Sixth of June, One thousand feven hundred and ninety-feven, for prohibiting the Importation of Cambricks and French Lawns into this Kingdom; not being of the Manufacture of Ireland, except for the Purpofe of being Warehoused for Exportation.

An Act to repeal certain Parts of Three Acts, made in the Thirty-feventh and Thirty-eighth Years of the Reign of His prefent Majelty, for raifing a Provisional Force of Cavalry, and for making further Provision respecting such Part of the Provisional Cavalry of this Kingdon as is now actually called out and embodied.

An Act for the better Relief and Employment of the Poor of the Parish of Saint Bridget, otherwise Saint Bride, Fleet-Street, in the City of London.

An Act for explaining, amending, and rendering more effectual, feveral Acts paffed in the Ninth, Fifteenth, Twenty-fixth, and Thirty-fourth Years of the Reign of His prefent Majefty, for making and maintaining a Navigable Canal from the Coventry Canal Navigation to the City of Oxford.

An Act to amend and render more effectual an Act, passed in the Twenty-seventh Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, for rebuilding the Pier of Margate, in the Isle of Thanet, in the County of Kent, and for other Purposes mentioned in the faid Act.

An Act to enable the Lords of the Manor of Brixham, in the County of Devon, to repair and enlarge, or rebuild, the Pier or Quay at Brixham-Quay, within the faid Manor, to improve the Har, bour there, to regulate the Moorings of Veffels therein, and to establish a Market there.

An Act for dividing, allotting, and inclosing the Arable Lands, Intermixed Pattures, Open Fields, Half-Year Lands, Commons, and Wafte Grounds, within the Parish of Upton, in the County of Norfolk, and fuch Parts of the Open Fields, called Upton Field and Fishley Crofts, as lie in the Parish of Fishley, in the faid County, and for draining the fame.

An Act for rendering more effectual an Act, paffed in the Twelfth Year of the Reign of His prefent Majefty, intituled, "An Act for making and keeping in Repair a Road or Paffage for Horfes on the Banks of the River Severn, between Bewdley-Bridge and a Place called the Meadow-Wharf, at Coalbrook Dale, for haling and drawing Veffels along the faid River, and for other Purpofes therein-mentioned."

An Act for continuing for Twenty-one Years, and from thence to the End of the then next Seffion of Parliament, the Term, and altering and enlarging the Powers of Two feveral Acts, the one made and paffed in the Twenty-fifth Year of the Reign of His late Majetty King George the Second, and the other in the Eleventh Year of the Reign of His prefent Maajefty, for repairing the Road from Knarcfborough; in the County of York, by Long Flatt-Lane, Gouldfbrough-Fields, Flaxby, Allerton, Mauleverer, and Scate-Moor, to Grænhammerton, in the fame
