

then and there attend to receive what may become payable to them; and not only bring with them the Affidavit required touching their not having enjoyed the Benefit of any Public Employment either at Sea or on Shore during the Time they are to be paid their Half-Pay, but also to produce Certificates that they have subscribed to the Test, and taken the Oaths of Allegiance required by Act of Parliament to His present Majesty: and in case any of the said Officers should not be able to attend themselves, but employ Attornies for that Purpose, that the said Attornies do produce the like Certificates and Affidavits from the Persons they are employed by.

Where Officers are abroad on Leave, their Agents are to produce attested Copies of such Leave before the Half-Pay can be paid.

And, as by Act of Parliament passed in the Thirty-fifth Year of His present Majesty's Reign, intituled "An Act for establishing a more easy and expeditious Method for the Payment of Officers belonging to His Majesty's Navy," it is enacted by the 20th Clause of the said Act, "That if any Commissioned or War-rant Naval Officer who shall be entitled to receive Half-Pay, and shall be desirous to receive and be paid the same at or near to the Place of his Residence, he may apply to the Treasurer of His Majesty's Navy, in London, to have such Half-Pay paid at or near the Place of his Residence, in the Manner pointed out by the said Act." Notice is hereby further given, that the Half-Pay ending 31st December, 1798, will commence paying on the 1st April, and all Persons desirous of having their Half-Pay remitted to them may apply as above-directed.
