I Have the Satisfaction to transmit herewith, for their Lordships' Information, a Letter I received from Captain Seymour, of His Majesty's Sloop Spitfire, acquainting me he captured the *Resolu*, a French Privateer, the 31st *Ultimo*, which, together with the *Spitfire*, arrived here this Morning.

I Have the Honor to acquaint you, that the *Spitfire* captured, in the violent Gale of the 31st *Ultimo*, Scilly bearing N. N. W.
