THIS Day the Lords being met, a Message was sent to the Honorable House of Commons by Sir Francis Molyneux, Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that *The Lords, authorized by virtue of His Majesty's Commission for declaring His Royal Assent to several Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate Attendance of this Honorable House in the House of Peers to hear the Commission read;* and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and several other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Acts, was read accordingly; and the Royal Assent given to

An Act to continue, until the Tenth Day of July, One thousand seven hundred and ninety-nine, and amend an Act passed in the last Session of Parliament, Chapter Ninety-two, videlicet, on the Twentieth Day of June, One thousand seven hundred and ninety-eight, for granting to His Majesty Additional Duties on Distilleries in the several Parts of the Highlands of Scotland for a limited Time, and for regulating the Duties on Distilleries in the respective Districts in Scotland, and for granting to His Majesty certain Additional Duties on Sprits distilled for Consumption, and a Duty on unmalted Grain used in Distillation in Scotland.

An Act to permit Ships to sail from certain Ports of the Island of Newfoundland, and from the Coast of Labrador, without Convoy.
