According to the most recent Accounts from the Auftrian Army it appears, that after the Action of the 21st Ultimo, General Jourdan retreated in the Night, between the 21st and 22d, to Stockach and Engen. He then occupied the Line from Shaffoulen through Engen to Dutlingen; in the Neighbour-hood of which laft Place, he affembled the principal Part of his Army. The Archduke advanced towards him on the 25th, when General Jourdan at-tacked the Auftrians. His Left Wing was at first fuccefsful; but his Centre and Right having been defeated, he was obliged to retreat with his whole Army in great Diforder; his Right Wing to-
