YOU will be pleased to acquaint their Lordships, that Captain Barton, of His Majesty's Ship Concorde, captured on the 14th Ultimo, to Windward of Antigua, La Prudent French Ship Privateer, Copper-bottomed, of Eighteen Guns and One Hundred Men.
