## PRESENT, The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

W HEREAS His Majefty was gracioufly pleafed, by His Royal Proclamation bearing Date the Twenty-fixth Day of December, One thousand seven hundred and ninety-two, to promise and declare, that the Bounties of Five Pounds for every Able Seaman, and Two Pounds Ten Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, fit for His Majefty's Service, fhould be paid in the Manner thereby directed to every fuch Able and Ordinary Seaman, not above the Age of Fifty nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who should, on or before the Twenty-eighth Day of February then following, enter themselves to serve in His Majesty's Royal Navy, either with the Captains or Lieutenants of His Majefly's Ships or Veffels, or Officers employed on Shore for raising Men for the Service of the Royal Navy: And whereas His Majefty was also graciously pleased, by his faid Proclama-tion, to declare, that all Able-bodied Landmen, not above the Age of Thirty-five nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who should fo enter themselves as aforefaid, fhould receive the Sum of Thirty Shillings each Man, as His Majefty's Royal Bounty : And whereas His Majelty was alfo gracioully pleafed, by His Royal Proclamation bearing Date the Sixteenth Day of the faid Month of February, One thousand seven hundred and ninety-three, to promise and declare, that a Reward of Twenty Shillings for every Able and Ordinary Seaman, fit to ferve on board His Majefty's Ships, flould be paid to any Perfon who flould difcover any Seaman or Seamen who might conceal him or themfelves, fo that fuch Seaman or Seamen should be taken for His Majelty's Service, on or before the Thirtieth Day of April then next, by any of His Majefty's Sea Officers appointed to raite Men on Shore, or by the Captains or Commanders of any of His Majefty's Ships or Veffels in the Ports or on the Coalts of this Kingdom : And whereas the Time limited by the faid Proclamations for Payment of the faid Bounties and Reward hath been prolonged and extended to the Thirtieth Day of this inftant April; and it being judged expedient for His Majefty's Service that the faid Bounties and Reward fhould be continued to be paid for fome Time longer; His Majefty, with the Advice of His Privy Council, doth therefore order, and it is hereby accordingly ordered, that the Time limited for Payment of the faid Bounties and Reward be prolonged and extended from the faid Thirtieth Day of this inftant April to the Thir-

tieth Day of June next inclusive :-- Whereof all Perfons concerned are to take Notice, and govern Steph. Cottrell: themfelves accordingly.

## Whitehall, April 27, 1799.

As feveral Counterfeits of Foreign Copper Coins have been lately illegally made, as well as Counterfeits of the Gold and Silver Coin refembling the Gold and the Gola and Suver Coin rejencing the Gola and Silver Coin of Foreign Princes and States; the fol-lowing Abstracts of Two Acts of Parliament, for preventing fuch Practices, are published for the In-formation of all Persons who may be ignorant of the Penalties they incur by Disobedience of them.

By Statute 37 George III. Chap. 126.

IF any Person or Persons shall make, coin, or counterfeit any Kind of Coin, not the proper Coin of this Realm, nor permitted to be current within the fame, but refembling, or with Intent to refemble, or look like any Gold or Silver of any Foreign Prince, State, or Country, or to pals for fuch Foreign Coin, fuch Perfon or Perfons offending therein shall be deemed and adjudged to be guilty of Felony, and may be transported for any Term of Years not exceeding Seven Years; and Juffices may grant Warrants for fearching fuspected Places for fuch laft-mentioned Foreign Coin.

And if any Perfon or Perfons shall bring into this Realm any fuch false or counterfeit Coin as afore-faid, refembling, or made with Intent to refemble, or look like any Gold or Silver Coin of any Foreign Prince, State, or Country, or to pals as fuch Fo-reign Coin, knowing the fame to be falle or counterfeit, to the Intent to utter the fame within this Realm, or within any Dominions of the fame; all and every fuch Perfon or Perfons shall be deemed and adjudged to be guilty of Felony, and may be transported for any Term of Years not exceeding Seven Years.

And as feveral Counterfeits of Foreign Copper Coins called Tompes and Sous Marques, current in His Majefly's Colonies in the Weft Indies and America, have lately been exported from England to the faid Colonies; the following Abstract of an Act of Par-liament, passed in the 38th Year of His Majesly, is published for the Information of all Persons who may be ignorant of the Penalties they may incur by a. Disobedience to them.

By Statute 38 George III. Chap. 57. ALL Copper Coin whatfoever, not being the legal Copper Coin of this Kingdom, and all counterfeit Gold or Silver Coin made to the Similitude or Refemblance, or intended to refemble any Gold or Silver Coin, either of this Kingdom or of any other Country which shall, under any Pretence, Name, or Defcription whatfoever, be exported or shipped, or laden, or put on board any Ship, Vessel, or Boat, for the Purpole of being exported from this Kingdom to the Island of Martinique, or any of His Majelly's Islands or Colonies in the West Indies or America, shall be forfeited, and the fame shall and may be feized, fued for, profecuted, and recovered in fuch Courts, and by fuch Ways, Means, and Methods, and the Produce thereof difpoled of and applied in fuch Manner, and to fuch Ufes and Purpoles, as any Forfeiture incurred by any Law re-ipecting the Revenue of the Cuitoms, may now br
