The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. WHEREAS the Time limited by His Majesty's Order in Council of the Thiry-first Day of October last, prohibiting the Transporting into any Parts out of this Kingdom, any Pot-Ashes or Pearl Ashes, (except as in the said Order is mentioned,) did expire upon the Seventh Day of this instant May: And whereas it is judged expedient that the said Prohibition should be continued for some Time longer: His Majesty doth therefore, with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit, and command, That no Person or Persons whosoever do, at any Time during the Space of Six Months, to commence from the said Seventh Day of this instant May, exthe faid Seventh Day of this instant May, export, or attempt to export, transport, carry, or convey, or lade or lay on board of any Ship, Vessel, or Boat, in order to be exported, transported, carried, or conveyed out of this Kingdom, any Pot-Ash or Pearl-Ash, without Leave, or Per-mission being first had and obtained from His Ma-jesty or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incur-ring the Forseitures inslicted by an Act, passed in the Thirty-fourth Year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An Act for indemnifying all Persons who have been concerned in advising or carrying into Exe"cution an Order of the Lords Commissioners of " His Majesty's Treasury respecting the Exportation " of Pot-Ashes or Pearl-Ashes; for preventing Suits " in consequence of the same; for authorizing His "Majesty to prohibit the Exportation or carrying "Coastwife of Pot-Ashes or Pearl-Ashes, and for " making further Provisions relative thereto:" But it is, nevertheless, His Majesty's Pleasure, that nothing herein contained shall extend, or be con-firmed to extend, to prevent the Exportation of the said Articles to Ireland, or to His Majesty's Islands of Guernsey, Jersey, Alderney, Sark, or Man, or to His Majesty's Colonies or Plantations in America or the West Indies, or to Newfoundland, or to His Majesty's Forts and Settlements on the Coast of Africa, or to the Island of St. Helena, or to the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies:
