WHEREAS the Time limited by His Majefty's W Order in Council of the Twenty-eighth Day of November laft, for prohibiting the Exportation out of this Kingdom, or carrying Coaftwife, Gun-powder or Saltpetre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, will expire upon the Seventh Day of this inflant June: And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majesty's Service, and the Safety of this Kingdom, that the faid Prohibition should be continued for some Time longer: His Majesty doth therefore, with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit, and command, that no Perfon or Perfons whatfoever (except the Mafter-General of the Ordnance for His Majefty's Service) General of the Ordnance for His Majefty's Service) do, at any Time during the Space of Six Months, to commence from the Seventh Day of this in-flant June, prefume to transport into any Parts out of this Kingdom, or carry Coaftwife, any Gunpowder or Saltpetre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, or thip or lade any Gunpowder or Saltpetre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammu-nition, on board any Ship or Veffel, in order to transporting the fame into any Parts beyond the Seas. or carrying the fame Coaftwife, without Leave Seas, or carrying the fame Coaffwife, without Leave or Permiffion in that Behalf first obtained from His Majefty, or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incur-ting and fuffering the respective Forfeitures and Penalties inflicted by an Act, passed in the Twenty-ninth Year of His late Majesty's Reign, intituled "An Act "to empower His Majesty to prohibit the Export-" ation of Saltpetre, and to enforce the Law for em-" powering His Majefty to prohibit the Exportation " of Gunpowder, or any Sort of Arms and Ammuni-"tion; and alfo to empower His Majefty to reftrain the carrying Coaftwile of Saltpetre, Gunpowder, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition."—And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majefty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Mafter General of the Ordnance, and His Majefty's Secretary at War, are to give the necessary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain. WHEREAS the Time limited by His Majefty's Order in Council of the Twenty eighth Day of November laft, prohibiting the Transport-ation into any Parts out of this Kingdom, of the Wood called Lignum Vitæ, will expire upon the Tenth of this inflant June: And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majefty's Service that the faid Prohibition should be continued for fome Time longer: His Majefty doth therefore, with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit, and command, That no Perlon or Perlons wholoever do, at any Time for the Space of Six Months, to commence from the faid Tenth Day of this inftant June, export, or attempt to export, transport, carry, or convey, or lade or lay on board of any Ship, Vefiel, or Boat, in order to be exported, transported, carried, or conveyed out of this Kingdom, any of the Wood called Lignum Vitæ, without Leave or Permiffion being first had and obtained from His Majesty, or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring the Forfeitures inflicted by an Act, palled in the Thirty-fourth Year of His Majefty's Reign, intituled " An Act for indemnifying all Perfons who have " been concerned in adviling or carrying into Exe-" cution an Order of the Lords Commiffioners of "His Majefty's Treafury respecting the Exportation of Pot-Ashes or Pearl-Ashes; for preventing Suits " in confequence of the fame; for authorizing His "Majefty to prohibit the Exportation or carrying "Coaftwife of Pot-Afhes or Pearl-Afhes, and for "making further Provisions relative thereto:" But it is, neverthelefs, His Majefty's Pleafure, that nothing herein contained shall extend, or be conftrued to extend, to prevent any Ship or Veffel from taking or having on board any of the faid Wood called Lignum Vitæ, which may be neceffary for the Ufe of the faid Ship or Veffel during the Courfe of her intended Voyage; nor to prevent the Exportation of the faid Wood called Lignum Vitæ to Ireland, or to His Majefty's Islands of Guern-fey, Jerfey, Alderney, Sark, or Man, or to His Majefty's Colonies or Plantations in America or

the West Indies, or to Newfoundland, or to His Majesty's Forts and Settlements on the Coast of Africa, or to the Island of St. Helena, or to the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies: Provided that, upon the Exportation of the faid Wood called Lignum Vitæ to Ireland, or to His Majefty's Islands of Guernfey, Jerfey, Alderney, Sark, or Man, or to His Majetty's Colonies or Plan-tations in America or the Weft Indies, or to the Island of Newfoundland, or to His Majesty's Forts and Settlements on the Coaft of Africa, or to the Island of St. Helena, or the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies, the Exporters of the faid Wood called Lignum Vitæ do first make Oath of the true Destination of the fame to the Places for which it shall be entered Outwards, before the Entry of the fame shall be made; and do give full and fufficient Security, by Bond, to the Satif-faction of the Commissioners of His Majesty's Cuftoms, to carry the faid Wood called Lignum Vitæ to the Places for which it is fo entered Outwards, and none other; and fuch Bond fhall not be cancelled, or delivered up, until Proof be made to the Satisfaction of the faid Commiffioners, by the Production, within a Time to be fixed by the faid Commiffioners, and fpe-cified in the Bond, of a Certificate or Certificates, in fuch Form and Manner as shall be directed by the faid Commissioners, shewing that the faid Wood called Lignum Vitæ has been duly landed at the Places for which it was entered Outwards : And the Right Honorable the Lords Commiffioners of His Majefty's Treasury, the Commiffioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, and the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, are to give the neceffary Directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.
