H Erewith I transmit you, for the Information of my Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, the Copy of a Letter from the Right Honorable Lord Mark Robert Kerr, Captain of His Majefty's

Ship Cormorant, to Rear-Admiral Duckworth, giv-ing an Account of the Capture of a Spanish Cor-vette. Sr. VINCENT.

Thurfday, 19th March, 1799, Colombrettes, SIR, W. N. W. 7 Leagues. Have the Honor to acquaint you, that having parted Company with His Majelty's Ship Centaur on the 16th Instant, in Chace of a Spanish Frigate, I proceeded to the Rendezvous; and on the 19th, perceiving a Brig to Leeward, I gave Chace, and after Four Hours brought her too.

She proved to be a Spanish Brig of War, named El Vincelo, mounting Eighteen Six-Pounders on her Gun-Deck, and Six Brass Four-Pounders on her Quarter-Deck, and Two on her Forecastle, and having One Hundred and Forty-four Men on board. During ther Chace the threw Six of her Six-Pounders overboard. I have the Honor to be, &c. &c.

jesty's Ship La Revolutionnaire, informing me of his having captured Le Victoire French Brig Privateer, from Bayonne. This Prize arrived here Yefterday, was captured in Latitude 48 Deg. 30 Min. and 19 Deg. Longitude Welt, and left La Revolu-tionnaire, going in Queft of a large Ship Privateer, which she had gained Information of.

His Majefly's Ship Revolutionnaire, at Sea, SIR, 30th May, 1799. I Have the Honor to inform you, that this Evening, after a Chace of Eight Hours, His Majefly's Ship under my Command captured L'Victoire French Brig Beinstear, mounting Sinteen Nine Boundary Brig Privateer, mounting Sixteen Nine-Pounders, and One Hundred and Sixty Men; out Nine Days from Bayonne; fitted for a Three Months' Cruize, but had not taken any Thing. L'Victoire is a very fine new Veffel, and fails remarkably faft.
