- 2l. 2s. by any Person keeping a Coach or other Carriage, upon which any Duty under the Management of the Commissioners for the Affairs of Taxes is chargeable, and on which any Armorial Bearing, or Ensign, shall be painted, marked, or affixed.
- 1l. 1s. by any Person not keeping any such Coach or other Carriage, who shall be charged to the Duties on Inhabited Houses, or on Houses, Windows, or Lights, by any Act or Acts of Parliament.
- 10s. 6d. by any Person not keeping any such Coach or other Carriage, not being charged to the said Duties on Inhabited Houses, or on Houses, Windows, or Lights.
