P R E S E N T,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS it has been represented to His Majesty at this Board, that the Price of Copper has very greatly increased within the last Twelve Months, and is now exceedingly high; and that there is a great Want thereof for the Use of His Majesty's Navy, as well as for the Merchant Shipping and Manufactures of this Kingdom: His Majesty, taking the same into Consideration, doth therefore, with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit, and command, that no Person or Persons whatsoever do at any Time for the Space of Six Months, to commence from the Date of this His Majesty's Order, presume to export out of this Kingdom to any Parts beyond the Seas, any Sheet Copper, or Copper in Bolt-Staves, Bars, Sheets, Rings, and Nails, or Copper in such a State as may be easily converted into or made useful as a Naval Store, or ship or lade any of the Articles abovementioned, on board any Ship or Vessel, in order to exporting the same beyond the Seas, without Leave or Permission being first had and obtained from His Majesty or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring the Forfeitures inflicted by an Act passed in the Thirty-third Year of His Majesty's Reign, Cap. 2; and also by an Act passed in the Thirty-fourth Year of His Majesty's Reign, Cap. 34; any Thing contained in His Majesty's Order in Council of the 26th Day of June last to the contrary notwithstanding: and the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, and the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, are to give the necessary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain.

COPY of a Letter from the Right Honorable Henry Dundas, One of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, to the Right Honorable Lord Leslie, Colonel of the Surrey Yeomanry Cavalry, dated Wimbledon, July 4, 1799.

MY LORD,

THE Corps of Yeomanry Volunteers which your Lordship commands, have so invariably distinguished themselves by their exemplary Conduct and Proffers of Service whenever their Country might stand most in need of it, as to have repeatedly attracted His Majesty's Notice and Approbation; and I have this Day received His Majesty's special Commands, to convey to you, and to the Corps of Surrey Yeomanry, the Sense His Majesty entertains of their meritorious Exertions. His Majesty is aware of the particular Sentiment of Loyalty and Attachment to his Person which induced the Surrey Yeomanry to give their Attendance at Wimbledon this Day, and he has commanded me to return them his warmest Thanks.

The Knowledge I have of the great Exertions so uniformly bestowed by your Lordship upon the Formation and Discipline of the Surrey Yeomanry, in consequence of which they have arrived at their present Perfection, makes it impossible for me to obey the Commands I have received from His Majesty without participating in the cordial Satisfaction your Lordship must feel on the present Occasion.

*Extract of a Letter from Lord Viscount Duncan, Admiral of the White, &c. &c. to Evan Nepean, Esq; dated on board the Kent, off the Texel, the 4th July, 1799.*

I Enclose, for their Lordships' Information, a Letter I received Yesterday from Captain Winthrop, of His Majesty's Ship *Circe*.

MY LORD, *Circe, at Sea, June 29, 1799.*

HAVING received Information that several Dutch Gun-Vessels were lying at the Back of the Island of Ameland, and Captains Temple and Boorder, of His Majesty's Sloops *Jalouse* and

L'Espeigle, having very handsomely volunteered their Services to cut them out, I ordered the Boats of His Majesty's Ships named in the Margin\* to proceed under their Command on the Night of the 27th Instant for that Purpose, and anchored with the Ships as near the Shore as possible, in Readiness to afford every Assistance in my Power.

I am sorry to say it now appears that the Gun-Vessels had previously shifted their Birth with the Ebb Tide, and were lying a-ground when the Boats got in, at a Place where it was impossible to get near them. The Officers and Men were therefore ordered to cut out as many Vessels from the Wadde as it might be practicable to bring away, and I have the Satisfaction to add they succeeded in getting out Twelve, without a Man being killed or wounded, though the Enemy annoyed them as much as possible from their Batteries. Six of the Vessels have valuable Cargoes, and were bound to Amsterdam; the others are in Ballast.

DISPATCHES, of which the following are Extracts, have been received from the Right Honorable Lord Henley and Lieutenant-Colonel Craufurd by the Right Honorable Lord Grenville, His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Foreign Department.

*Zurich, June 24, 1799.*

I Have the Honor to inform your Lordship, that a Courier arrived this Afternoon from Turin with official Dispatches from General Kray to the Archduke Charles, informing His Royal Highness, that Marshal Suwarrow had marched with a Part of his Army against General Macdonald, who was attempting to effect a Junction with Moreau, and had defeated him in an Action which took place at Gioani, near Bobbio.

General Haddick has received Orders from Marshal Suwarrow to return by the Simplon into the Valais, which will, no Doubt, occasion a material Alteration in the Position of the Armies.

*Vienna, June 23, 1799.*

I Think it right to lose no Time in informing your Lordship, that, by Accounts just arrived from Marshal Suwarrow, dated the 13th, from Asti, the Intelligence of the Enemy's Fleet having effected a Disembarkation at Genoa, appears to have been unfounded, as well as that of the exaggerated Amount of the Force of General Moreau's Army.

Letters were at the same Time received from General Kray of the 15th, which agree with those of the Marshal in stating, that the Enemy were moving, with a Force, which the most authentic Accounts made to amount to about Twenty-five Thousand Men, through the Modenese, in the Direction of Mantua, probably with the View of raising the Siege of that Fortrefs. General Kray, who had already marched with a few of his Cavalry, in Obedience to Marshal Suwarrow's Orders, had in consequence determined to return to his Station before Mantua: The Marshal had detached to him Re-inforcements, and intended immediately to march himself to Valentia: And the Austrian Troops, which occupied Reggio, Parma, and Modena, &c. had retired, and were concentrating themselves towards Mantua.

The Ceremony of the Baptism of the Great Duchess Maria Alexandrowne, Daughter of the Great Duke Alexander, took place on Sunday last at the Imperial Chapel at Pawlowsky, in the Presence of the Court and the Foreign Ministers. The Sponsors were, His Imperial Majesty, His Majesty, and the Emperor of the Romans, and Her Imperial Highness the Great Duchess Alexandrina. His Majesty was represented on this Occasion by Sir Charles Whitworth, K. B. His Majesty's Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary to the Emperor of Russia.
