The Affair lafted the greater Part of the Day; and although the French at first gained fome Ground, they were afterwards completely repulsed; and General Yellachitz's Corps reoccupied all its former Posts, except Brunnen, of which the Enemy retained Posseffion on the Evening of the 3d, but from whence he was also repulsed the next Morning.

W.E., your Majefty's moft faithful Subjects the Britifh Inhabitants of Bombay and its Dependencies, animated by an ardent Zeal for our Country, which we truft will ever be the diftinguifhing Characteriftic of Britons, have exerted our beft Endeavours, by a general Contribution in fupport of the prefent juft and neceffary War in which we are engaged, in Oppolition to an unprovoked Combination of your Majefty's Enemies. Reflecting with equal Pride and Gratitude on the Bleffings we derive from a Conftitution which has elevated the National Character through Ages; and by the Security it affords to Religion, Liberty, and Property, has roufed and maintained a Spirit of Commercial Adventure equally productive of Public Wealth and Individual Profperity, it became our Duty as well as our earneft Inclination to unite for its Protection. Of this invaluable Syftem we look up to your Majefty, under the Divine Ruler of the Univerfe, as the faithful Guardian, and as further endeared to us by thofe amiable Perfonal Virtues which are the peculiar Ornaments of your Character.

We feel particular Pleafure at this Period in congratulating your Majefty on the late Succefs, which, by the Bleffing of God, your Naval Arms have obtained in the Mediterranean under Admiral Sir Horatio Nelfon, againft an inveterate and ufurping Foe, whofe Hoftility is directed to the Defruction of every Tie that can bind Society in good Order and Government.
