W Hereas it has been humbly reprefented to His Ma-jefty, that on Monday the 8th Day of this inflant July, about Half past One o'Clock in the Morning, Mr. William Rutter, Sitter of the Custom-House Boat stationed at Lymington, within the Port of Southampton, flationed at Lymington, within the Port of Southampton, in the County of Hants, being out upon Duty with Four of his Men in the faid Boat to the Westward of Hurst Castle, near Mineway, he observed a Vessel coming in from Sea towards the Shore, which, suspecting to be employed in suggling, he ordered his Men to row towards her for the Purpose of cutting her off from the Shore: that on coming near the faid Vessel Mr. Rutter discovered her to be a Lugger of between Twenty and Thirty Tons Burthen, with Black Canvas Waistleibts and Tallogued Bottow and Tallowed Bottom, carrying a Tanned Mainfail, White Forefail, Mizen, and Jib; and about Two o'Clock the fame Morning when he got within Forty Yards of the faid Lugger, near a Place called Beacon Bunny, about Three Hundred Yards from the Shore, he hailed her and enquired what Lugger fhe was, upon which one of the Creen who give flanding ho the Afran which one of the Crew who was flanding by the After-Part of the Mainfail, which had been hoified a few Minutes before, afked "What Boat is that ?" and being Minutes before, afrea "What Boat is that ? and being anfwered that it was the Cuflom-Houfe Boat, he told Mr. Rutter, that he mufl not come on board but keep off. Mr. Rutter then told the Crew on board the Lugger to have down their Sails, as he fhould come on board of them prefently, upon which the fame Perfon again afked what Boat it wiss, and upon being anfuered that it was the Lymington Cufforn-Houfe Boat, fome Perfon on board the Lugger, and who was fland-ing near the Afterpart of the Mainfail, immediately fired with a Blunderbufs or Gun at the Boat, by which Charles Colborne, one of Mr. Rutter's Boatmen, was killed, and William Lyne, another of his Boatmen, was feverely wounded in the Right Arm: that Mr. Rutter then requested the Perfons on board the Lugger not to fire again, and they were told what had hap-pended to the Cuftom-Houfe Boat, but no Anfwer being returned, he directed the Remainder of his Men to row eff as fall as possible. The faid Lugger was after-wards objerved about Three Leagues to the Westward

wards observed about I bree Leagues to the weyewards of the Needles, fleering to the Southward.
