Copy of a Letter from Vice-Admiral Rainier, Com-mander in Chief of His Majefly's Ships and Veffels in the Eaft Indies, to Evan Nepean, Efq; dated in Bombay Harbour, April 1, 1799.

ŚIR;

I Have much Pleafure in acquainting you, for their Lordfhips' Information, that Captain Cooke, of His Majefty's Ship La Sybille, captured the French National Frigate La Forte, of much superior Force, on the 28th of February laft, off the Sand-Heads of Bengal River, after a well fought Night Action, wherein Captain Cooke appears to have difplayed the greateft Degree of Courage, Prefence of Mind, and professional Abilities, and to have been nobly supported by the intrepid Conduct of his Officers and Crew, Part of which coulilied of a Company of His Majelly's Scotch Brigade, embarked by Order of his Excellency the Governor-General, on La Sybille's Ship's Company having been fo much reduced by Deaths, and debilitated by the fevere Illness contracted last Year at Calcutta, during the Repair of that Ship, on which Account many of them were left ashore at the Hospital, and most of the Remainder of her old and valuable Crew in a weak State of Convalefcency.

I feel the most fensible Concern in acquainting you, that the universal Joy and Satisfaction diffused over every Countenance on hebring the News of this gallant Capture, of fo much Importance to the trading Part of the Community, and allo to the Public Service, was confiderably damped on being informed that Captain Cooke's Wounds were of fo dangerous a Nature as almost to preclude every Hope of his Recovery.

I transmit a Copy of Lieutenant Hardyman's Letter on the Occasion, containing a Brief Account of the Action, addressed to General Sir Alured Clarke, K. B. Vice-President of the Government of Fort William, as it was communicated to me by his Excellency the Earl of Mornington, then at Fort Saint George, who has been pleafed to teffify the molt fincere Regret for Captain Cooke's melancholy Situation.

It may be proper to inform you, that my not having received Lieutenant Hardyman's Account of the Action is owing to the Uncertainty where to address me, but which I shall enclose, if it arrives in Time.

I am informed, by an Officer in the Marine of this Port, who was on board La Forte last September at the Mauritius, that fhe mounted Thirty Four-Pounders on the Main-Deck, Fourteen Nine-Pounders, and Eight Thirty-fix Pounders, Carronades, with a Line of Brafs Swivels on a Flush Deck, continued from the Quarter-Deck to the Forecastle.

It appears the paffed Achin-Head nearly about the fame Time His Majefty's Ship Sceptre did with the Convoy from the Cape of Good Hope, and did not reach the Sand-Heads till the ufual Time was expired for expecting any of the Enemy's Cruizers thereabouts.

You will pleafe to inform their Lordships, that I shall order La Forte to be purchased and com-missioned for His Majesty's Service, agreeable to the Cuftom of the Service, and appoint Lieutenant
