Rochdale Canal.

Notice is hereby given, that Application is intended to be made at the next Session of Parliament, for Leave to increase the Rates of Tonnage on the Rochdale Canal, granted by an Act, passed in the Thirty-fourth Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, intituled An Act for making and maintaining a Navigable Canal from the Calder Navigation, at or near Sowerby-Bridge Wharf, in the Parish of Halifax, in the West Riding of the County of York, to join the Canal of his Grace the Duke of Bridgewater, in the Parish of Manchester, in the County-Palatine of Lancaster; and also certain Cuts from the said intended Canal; also for Leave to decrease the Hundred Weight from Six Score Pounds, as granted and allowed in and by the said Act of Parliament, to Five Score and Twelve Pounds the Hundred Weight; also for Leave to vary or alter the Line of the said Canal out of the present Parliamentary Line thereof, from or near a certain Place or Point called Gorells, in the Township of Castleton, in the Parish of Rochdale, in the said County of Lancaster, in, to, or through the several Townships of Castleton, in the Parish of Rochdale aforesaid and Hopwood, Thornham, and Middleton, in the Parish of Middleton, and Chadderton, in the Parish of Prestwich-cum Oldham, all in the said County of Lancaster, to communicate again with the Parliamentary Line of the said Canal at or near the Place where the same crosses a certain Brook commonly called Chadderton Brook, in the Township of Chadderton aforesaid; and also for Leave to vary or alter the Line of the said Canal out of the present Parliamentary Line thereof, from a certain other Place or Point near the Northerly Side of a certain Dwelling-House known by the Sign of the Pack-Horse, and now in the Occupation of Thomas Ogden, situated in the Township of Failsworth, in, to, or through the several Townships of Failsworth, New-
