jesty King George the Second; and all Ships and I Veffels, Persons, Goods, and Merchandizes whatfoever, liable to Quarantine, and not being furnished with clean Bills of Health; from whatever Port or Place the same shall come, shall (until further Order) perform their Quarantine in Standgate Creek, and no where elfe; and that no Person from on board any fuch Ship or Vessel be permitted to land or come on Shore, until discharged from such Quarantine.

And His Majesty, by and with the Advice of his Privy Council, is hereby further pleased to order, that no Goods, Wares, or Merchandizes imported in any Ship or Vessel arriving without a clean Bill of Health, he admitted to Entry in any of the Ports of this Kingdom, until fuch Goods, Wares, and Merchandizes shall have been unpacked, opened, and aired, on board One of the Hulks stationed in Standgate Creek for the Purpose of airing Goods subject to Quarantine, for the Space of Forty Days, according to fuch Regulations as have been established in that Behalf by any Order of the Lords of His Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council, touching Goods liable to perform Quarantine; or any other Regulations, Rules, Orders, and Directions which shall be made or given by any Order of His Majesty in Council with respect to opening and airing such Goods and Merchandizes, previous to the landing thereof; and to the Performance of Quarantine by the Crews or other Persons belonging to or being on board of the Ships or Veffels in which fuch Goods or Merchandizes shall be imported: And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majetty's Treafury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Master-General and Principal Officers of the Ordnance, His Majesty's Secretary at War, and the Governors or Commanders in Chief for the Time being of the faid respective Isles of Guernsey, Jersey, Alderney, Sark, and Man, are to give the necessary Directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.
