THE Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury have given Directions for paying off Exchequer-Bills, bearing Date the 31st of August, 1st, 8th and 12th of September 1798, issued pursuant to an Act of Parliament, passed in the Thirty-eighth Year of His present Majesty's Reign, Cap. 84, for enabling the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury to issue Exchequer-Bills to a limited Amount on the Credit of such Monies as should arise by virtue of an Act, passed in the Thirty-eighth Year of His Majesty's Reign, for granting an Aid or Contribution for the Prosecution of the War, &c.; and that the Principal and Interest on such Bills shall be paid at the Exchequer-Bill-Office, in Saint Margaret's-Street, between the two Palace-Yards, Westminster, on Thursday the 10th Day of October next; and Attendance will be given on Thursday the 26th of this instant September, and every succeeding Day (Sundays and Holidays excepted) until Tuesday the 8th Day of October next inclusive, for the Purpose of receiving the same: And for the greater Dispatch, the Bearers of the said Bills are desired to bring Lists thereof, containing the Numbers, in numerical Order, according to the Value of the said Bills, Times of Commencement of Interest, with the Principal Sums and Interest due upon the said Bills, to be computed at Three Pence Halfpenny by the Day on every 100l. from the Time of Commencement to the said 10th Day of October 1799; on which Day the Interest on the said Exchequer-Bills will cease: And they are desired to write their Names and Places of Abode on such Lists, and indorse their Names on the Back of the said Bills.
