An Act for enabling His Majefty to accept the Services of an additional Number of Volunteers from the Militia, under certain Reftrictions.

An Act for continuing and granting to His Majefty certain Duties upon Malt, Mum, Cyder, and Perry, for the Service of the Year One thousand eight hundred.

An Act for continuing and granting to His Majefty a Duty on Penfions, Offices, and Perfonal Ettates in England, Wales, and the Town of Berwick-upon-Tweed, and certain Dutics on Sugar, Malt, Tobacco, and Snuff, for the Service of the Year One thousand eight hundred.

Act Act for raifing a certain Sum of Money by Loans or Exchequer-Bills, for the Service of the Year One thousand eight hundred; and for permitting Exchequer-Bills, issued under an Act of the last Selfion of Parliament, for granting to His Majesty a certain Sum of Money out of the Confolidated Fund, and for other Purpofes; if not paid by a certain Day, to be received in Payment of any of the Branches of the Public Revenue. An Act for enabling His Maiesty to direct the

An AA for enabling His Majefty to direct the Iffue of Exchequer-Bills to a limited Amount, and in the Manner therein-mentioned, for the Relief of the Merchants of Liverpool and Lancafter.

An Act to enable the Lords Commissioners of His Majefty's Treafury to iffue Exchequer Bills to a limited Amount on the Credit of fuch Monics as may arife by virtue of an Act of the Thirtyeighth Year of His prefent Majefty's Reign, for granting certain Additional Duties of Cultoms on Goods exported and imported, and on Tonnage of Ships entering Outwards or Inwards, to or from Foreign Parts, until the figning the Preliminary Articles of Peace, and upon an Act of laft Seffion of Parliament, for granting certain Duties upon Income.

An Act to amend fo much of an Act made in the last Seffion of Parliament for granting certain Duties upon Income as relates to the Appropriation of the faid Duties, and of the Duties upon Goods imported and exported, granted by an Act of the Thirty-eighth Year of the Reign of His prefent Majesty.

An Act for allowing further Time for the Payment of Instalments on certain Sums of Money advanced by Way of Loan to feveral Perfons conuected wich and trading to the Islands of Grenada and Saint Vincent.

An Act for reducing, until the First Day of June One thousand eight hundred, the Duties upon Spirits difilled from Molasses or Sugar, or any Mixture therewith, for prohibiting the Difillation of Spirits from Wheat or Wheat Flour, and for reducing, until the Twentieth Day of September One thousand eight hundred, and better collecting the Duties payable on the Importation of Starch.
