And whereas by the faid Act, passed in the last Session of Parliament, it was further enacted, that from and after the passing of the said Act, and until the Expiration of Six Weeks from the Commencement of the then next Session of Parliament, it should be lawful for His Majesty, his Heirs, and Successors, and he and they were thereby authorized, with the Advice of his or their Privy Council, from Time to Time, when and as often as the fame shall be judged expedient, to permit generally, for a limited Time, the Importation into Great Britain, from any Port or Place whatever, in any British Ship or Vessel, or in any other Ship or Vessel belonging to Persons of any Kingdom or State in Amity with His Majesty, and navigated in any Manner whatever, any Beans called Kidney or French Beans, Tares, Lentiles, Callivances, and all other Sorts of Pulle, and also Bulls, Cows, Oxen, Calves, Sheep, Lambs, and Swine, Beef, Pork, Mutton, Veal, and Lamb, whether salted or otherwife, Bacon, Hams, Tongues, Butter, Cheefe, Potatoes, Rice, Sago, Sago Powder, Tapioca, Vermicelli, Millet Seed, Poultry, Fowls, Eggs, Game, and Sour Crout, without the Payment of any Duty whatever, at all Times before the faid Expiration of Six Weeks from the Commencement of the then next Seffion of Parliament, and in like Manner to recall fuch Permission, either in Partor in Whole, (if Circumstances should seems so to require,) any Thing in any Act or Acts of Parliament to the contrary thereof in anywife notwithstanding, subject, nevertheless, to the Provisoes therein mentioned, and hereinaster contained; which Act, by an Act passed in the present Session of Parliament, hath been continued, as aforesaid, until the Thirtieth Day of September One thousand eight hundred: His Majesty thereupon, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, and in pursuance of the Powers vested in him by the said Acts, has thought fit to order, and it is hereby ordered, that from and after the Date of this present Order, and until the Thirtieth Day of September One thousand eight hundred, it shall be lawful to import into any Port or Place of this Kingdom any of the Articles aforesaid, in any British Ship or Vessel, or in any other Ship or Vessel belonging to Persons of any Kingdom or State in Amity with His Majesty, and navigated in any Manner whatever, without Payment of any Duty whatfoever. Provided always that a due Entry shall he made of all such Articles as aforesaid that shall be fo imported, with the proper Officers of the Cuftoms at the Port where the fame shall be imported, under the Penalties and Forfeitures in the faid Act mentioned. And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury are to give Commissioners of Fils Magery, the necessary Directions herein accordingly.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. WHEREAS the Colony of Surinam, in South America, has been surrendered to His Majelty's Arms, and the Territory and Forts in the

other Articles as aforesaid, without Payment of any same are delivered up to His Majesty, and the said Duty whatsoever. Colony is now in His Majesty's Possessian; His Majetty is thereupon pleased to order and declare, and it is hereby ordered and declared, That all His loving Subjects may lawfully trade to and from the faid Colony of Surinam, fubject, nevertheless, to the fame Duties, Ruies, Regulations, Conditions, Re-firictions, Penalties, and Forfeitures to which the Trade to and from His Majesty's Colonies, Plantations, and Islands in the West Indies is, or shall be, subject by Law.

And His Majesty is further pleased to order and declare, and it is hereby ordered and declared, That all Commodities being of the Growth, Produce, or Manufactute of the faid Colony of Surinam, being in His Majesty's Possession, shall be permitted to be imported into any of the Ports of this Kingdom in British Ships, owned by His Ma-jesty's Subjects, and navigated according to Law; subject to the same Duties, Rules, Regulations, Reltrictions, Conditions, Penalties, and Forfeitures as Articles of the like Sort are subject to, coming from His Majesty's Colonies, Plantations, or Islands in the West Indies: And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, and the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, are to give the necessary Directions herein as to them W. Fasukener. may respectively appertain.

Admiralty-Office, October 22, 1799. Extratl of a Letter from Vice-Admiral Mitchell to Evan Nepean, Efq; dated on board His Majesty's Ship Isis, near the Vlieter, the 15th Instant.

Enclose a Copy of a Letter from Captain Campbell, giving an Account of the Capture of Four Gun Boats in the Zuyder Zee, and a Copy of a Letter from Captain Boorder, containing an Account of Two unsuccessful Attacks made by the Enemy on Lemmer; by all which their Lordships will perceive that I cannot too highly extol the Gallantry and good Conduct of these Captains, and of the Officers and Men under their Command.

His Majesty's Gun Brig Hasty, off SIR, Marken, Odober 7, 1799.

Beg to inform you, that I Yesterday sailed from Usk, with the Hasty, Defender, and Cracker Bries and Isa Schusty, Defender, and Cracker Brigs, and Isis Schuyt; and having reached this Place by Four A.M. I proceeded with the Boats to attempt cutting out the Dutch Gun Boats lying on or near the Pampus, and am happy to fay, fucceeded in getting Possession of Four without the Loss of a Man. They each mount Four long Guns or Carronades, and have between Twenty and Thirty Men; one of them built on Purpose for a Gun Vessel and quite new, carrying Two long Eighteen-Pounders in her Bow, and Two Eighteen-Pounder

Carronades on her Broadfide; the Rest are Schuyts. I beg to recommend to your Notice Messers. Hall and Winter, Midshipmen, for their spirited Behaviour on this Occasion, as also all the Seamen engaged, for their Alacrity in boarding, and good Conduct after having gained Possession. I have sent the Defender with Charge of the Gun Boats,
