

Jeffy, that on the 2 4th of July last, a Smuggling Luzger being observed by some Officers of the Revenue, in Cricketh or Kickith Bay, in the County of Carnarvon, then landing her Goods; Richard Bridgwater, Superwifor of Excise, Maurice Williams, Tide Surveyor of the Customs at Pullbely, in the said County, together with Two Tide Waiters and some other Officers in the Service of the Cufloms, went in a Boat in Purfuit of her: that when they came within about Three or Four Hundred Yards of the faid Smuggling Veffel, (the Custom-House Colours being then figing in the Boat, the Officers hailed her, upon which the Smugglers afked what Boat it was, and upon being told the King's Boat, they ordered the Officers to keep off or abide by the Con-fequence; but being told by the Officers that they should not, the Smugglers immediately fired a Mufket, the Ball from which came very near the King's Boat; the Smugglers then fired Eight other Mufkets, One of which puffed giers then fred Eight other Mujkets, One of which pailed between the Fore and Main-Maft of the King's Boats, and another close behind the Officer, Richard Bridgwater, and upon the Smugglers threatening to drive the Officers into the Water if they did not keep off, they returned without being able to board the faid Smuggling

Vessel.
The faid Vessel is about Thirty-three Tons Burthens Black Sides, and without a Name, and had about Eight or Twelve Hands on board, low Stern, wery narrow Waift Gunnell, and supposed to have been built at Dover, or in that Part of the Couff.

His Majesty, for the better discovering and bringing to Justice the Persons concerned in this Felony and Outrage, is hereby pleased to promise his most gracious Pardon to any One or more of the said Offenders, (except the Master or Commander on board the said Vessel, and the Person Persons who actually fired,) who shall discover his or their Accomplices, so that any One or more of them was he apprehended.
