**A**T the Court at *St. James's*, the 30th of *October* 1799,

P R E S E N T,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

**W**HEREAS the Time limited by His Majesty's Order in Council of the Seventeenth Day of May last, prohibiting the Transporting into any Parts out of this Kingdom, any Pot-Ashes or Pearl-Ashes, (except as in the said Order is mentioned,) will expire upon the Seventh Day of November next: And whereas it is judged expedient that the said Prohibition should be continued for some Time longer: His Majesty doth therefore, with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit, and command, That no Person or Persons whatsoever do, at any Time during the Space of Six Months, to commence from the said Seventh Day of November next, export, or attempt to export, transport, carry, or convey, or lade or lay on board of any Ship, Vessel, or Boat, in order to be exported, transported, carried, or conveyed out of this Kingdom, any Pot-Ash or Pearl-Ash, without Leave or Permission being first had and obtained from His Majesty, or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring the Forfeitures inflicted by an Act, passed in the Thirty-fourth Year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled "An Act for indemnifying all Persons who have been concerned in advising or carrying into Execution an Order of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury respecting the Exportation of Pot-Ashes or Pearl-Ashes; for preventing Suits in consequence of the same; for authorising His Majesty to prohibit the Exportation or carrying Coastwise of Pot-Ashes or Pearl-Ashes, and for making further Provisions relative thereto:" But it is, nevertheless, His Majesty's Pleasure, that nothing herein contained shall extend, or be construed to extend, to prevent the Exportation of the said Articles to Ireland, or to His Majesty's Islands of Guernsey, Jersey, Alderney, Sark, or Man, or to His Majesty's Colonies or Plantations in America or the West Indies, or to Newfoundland, or to His Majesty's Forts and Settlements on the Coast of Africa, or to the Island of St. Helena, or to the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies:

Provided that, upon the Exportation of the said Articles to Ireland, or to His Majesty's Islands of Guernsey, Jersey, Alderney, Sark, or Man, or to His Majesty's Colonies or Plantations in America or the West Indies, or to the Island of Newfoundland, or to His Majesty's Forts and Settlements on the Coast of Africa, or to the Island of St. Helena, or the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies, the Exporters of the said Articles do first make Oath of the true Destination of the same to the Places for which they shall be entered Outwards, before the Entry of the same shall be made; and do give full and sufficient Security, by Bond, to the Satisfaction of the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs, to carry the said Articles to the Places for which they are so entered Outwards, and none other; and such Bond shall not be cancelled, or delivered up, until Proof be made to the Satisfaction of the said Commissioners, by the Production, within a Time to be fixed by the said Commissioners, and specified in the Bond, of a Certificate or Certificates, in such Form and Manner as shall be directed by the said Commissioners, shewing that the said Articles have all been duly landed at the Places for which they were entered Outwards: And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, and the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, are to give the necessary Directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.

**A**T the Court at *St. James's*, the 30th of *October* 1799,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council,

**W**HEREAS the Time limited by His Majesty's Order in Council of the Twenty-sixth Day of April last, prohibiting the Exportation out of this Kingdom of any Sort of Rock Salt, did expire upon the Twenty-ninth Day of this instant October; And whereas it is judged expedient that the said Prohibition should be continued for some Time longer; His Majesty doth therefore, with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit, and command, that no Person or Persons

whatsoever do at any Time, during the Space of Six Months, to commence from the said Twentieth Day of this instant October, export, or attempt to export, transport, carry, or convey, or load or lay on board of any Ship, Vessel, or Boat, in order to be exported, transported, carried, or conveyed out of any Port or Place in Great Britain, any Sort of Rock Salt whatsoever, without Leave or Permission being first had and obtained from His Majesty or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring the Forfeitures inflicted by an Act, passed in the Thirty-sixth Year of His present Majesty's Reign, intitled "An Act for indemnifying all Persons who have been concerned in advising or carrying into Execution an Order of His Majesty in Council respecting the Exportation of Rock Salt, for preventing Suits in consequence of the same, for authorising His Majesty to prohibit the Exportation or carrying Coastwise of Rock Salt, and for making further Provisions relative thereto;" His Majesty, nevertheless, by the Advice aforesaid, hath thought fit to order, that nothing herein contained shall prevent Rock Salt being carried Coastwise, under the usual Rules, Regulations, and Restrictions, nor the Exportation of the same to Ireland, or to any other of His Majesty's Dominions, under the usual Conditions and Regulations, and upon Security being given by the Exporter, and Two other Persons, (of whom the Master of the Vessel shall be one,) by Bond, in such Penalty as shall be directed by the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs, that the said Rock Salt shall be exported to some Port or Place in His Majesty's Dominions, and none other; and that a Certificate shall be produced, within Six Months from the Date of the Bond, if such Rock Salt shall be entered out for any Part of His Majesty's Dominions in Europe; and within Twelve Months, if for any Part of His Majesty's Dominions in America or the West Indies; and within Eighteen Months, if for any of the British Settlements or Factories in Asia or Africa, under the Hand of the Principal Officer of the Customs at the Port or Place where such Rock Salt shall be so landed; and if there shall be no Officer of the Customs, then under the Hand of the Chief Magistrate of the Place, testifying that the said Rock Salt has been duly landed at the Port or Place for which the same was entered out.—And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, and the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, are to give the necessary Directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.

London, November 9, 1799.

Yesterday Harvey Christian Coombe, Esq; Lord Mayor Elect for the Year ensuing, was sworn at Guildhall; when the Chair, and other Ensigns of Mayoralty, were surrendered to him in the accustomed Manner.

This Day the new Lord Mayor, accompanied by the late Lord Mayor, the Aldermen, Recorder, and Sheriffs, in their Scarlet Gowns, went in their Coaches to the Water-side, the Sword and Mace being carried before them, and the City Officers attending; and from thence proceeded in the City Barge, attended by the several Companies in their respective Barges, adorned with Streamers and Pendants, to Westminster; and having walked round the Hall, and solemnly saluted all the Courts, they went to the Exchequer Bar, and the new Lord Mayor did there take the Oaths appointed; and having recorded Warrants of Attorney in the proper Courts, returned by Water to Black Friars, and from thence in Coaches, with the usual Solemnity, to Guildhall, where a magnificent Entertainment was provided; at which were present several of the Foreign Ministers, the Great Officers of State, divers of the Nobility, Lords of His Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council, the Judges, and many other Persons of Quality and Distinction.

Whitehall, November 2, 1799.

**W**hereas it has been humbly represented to His Majesty, that on the 24th of July last, a Smuggling Lugger being observed by some Officers of the Revenue, in Crickiuh Bay, in the County of Carnarvon, then landing her Goods; Richard Bridgewater, Supervisor of Excise, Maurice Williams, Tide Surveyor of the Customs at Pullhely, in the said County, together with Two Tide Waiters and some other Officers in the Service of the Customs, went in a Boat in Pursuit of her: that when they came within about Three or Four Hundred Yards of the said Smuggling Vessel, (the Custom-House Colours being then flying in the Boat,) the Officers hailed her, upon which the Smugglers asked what Boat it was, and upon being told the King's Boat, they ordered the Officers to keep off or abide by the Consequence; but being told by the Officers that they should not, the Smugglers immediately fired a Musket, the Ball from which came very near the King's Boat; the Smugglers then fired Eight other Muskets, One of which passed between the Fore and Main-Mast of the King's Boat, and another close behind the Officer, Richard Bridgewater, and upon the Smugglers threatening to drive the Officers into the Water if they did not keep off, they returned without being able to board the said Smuggling Vessel.

The said Vessel is about Thirty-three Tons Burthen, Black Sides, and without a Name, and had about Eight or Twelve Hands on board, low Stern, very narrow Waist Gunnell, and supposed to have been built at Dover, or in that Part of the Coast.

His Majesty, for the better discovering and bringing to Justice the Persons concerned in this Felony and Outrage, is hereby pleased to promise his most gracious Pardon to any One or more of the said Offenders, (except the Master or Commander on board the said Vessel, and the Person Persons who actually fired,) who shall discover his or their Accomplices, so that any One or more of them may be apprehended. 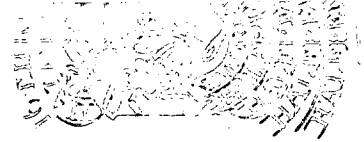
### EXCHEQUER BILLS

TO BE PAID OFF.

**T**HE Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury have given Directions for paying off the Exchequer Bills, bearing Date the 19th and 24th September 1798, issued pursuant to Act 38 Geo. III.
