W Hereas it has been bumbly reprefented to His Ma-jefly, that on the 24th of July laft, a Smuggling Lugger being obferved by fome Officers of the Revenue, in Cricketh or Kickith Bay, in the County of Carnar von the Linder And County of Carnar von then landing her Goods ; Richard Bridgwater, Supervifor of Excife, Maurice Williams, Tide Surveyor of the Cufloms at Pullbely, in the faid County, together with Two Tide Waiters and fome other Officers in the Service of the Cufloms, went in a Boat in Purfuit of ber stat when they came within about Three or Four Hundred Yards of the faid Smuggling Veffel, it the Cuflom Houfe Colours being then flying in the Boat, J the Officer's hailed her, upon which the Smugglers affeed what Post it more and upon heing told the King? Reat what Boat it was, and upon being told the King's Boat, they ordered the Officers to keep off or abide by the Con-fequence; but being told by the Officers that they found not, the Smugglers immediately fired a Musket, the Ball from which came very near the King's Boat ; the Smug glers then fired Eight other Muskets, One of which passed between the Fore and Main-Mast of the King's Boat, and another close behind the Officer, Richard Bridgwater, and upon the Smugglers threatening to drive the Officers into the Water if they did not keep off, they returned without being able to board the faid Smuggling

Veffel. The faid Veffel is about Thirty-three Tons Burthen, Black Sides, and without a Name, and had about Eight or Twelve Hands on board, low Stern, very narrow Waift Gunnell, and supposed to have been built at Dover, or in that Part of the Coafl.
