SIR,

Have defired Commodore Trowbridge to fend you, for the Information of their Lordinips, Extracts of all his Letters to me, with the Terms entered into with the French for the Evacuation of the City of Rome and Civita Vecchia; on which Event I fincerely congratulate their Lordships, and am, Sir, with great Respect, &c.

NELSON.

SIR, Civita Vecchid, October 5, 1799.

AM to request you will inform their Lordships, that I took Possession of Civita Vecchiâ; Corneto, and Tosa, on the 29th and 30th Ultimo, with Two Hundred Marian and Santan of the College. Two Hundred Marines and Seamen of the Culloden and Minotaur, and have aiready embarked and fent
