Sir,

H. Hardy is innocent and if you don't let her out of Jail, we will set your House on Fire and all ——— There were two of us concerned and before the Year is out, we will fire him and his old thatched Buildings and all ——— He is a Rascal ——— You cannot find us out, and we will do his old thatched Place soon ——— Doctor Holland is a Rascal, if you be an honest Man do not believe him.
