A T the Court at St. James's, the 20th of November 1799,

### PRESENT,

The KING's Moft Excellent Majefty in Council. WHEREAS by an Act, paffed in the last Sef-fion of Parliament, intituled "An Act to " encourage the Trade into the Levant Seas, by " providing a more convenient Mode of perform-"ing Quarantine, and for reducing the Duty "granted by an Act of the last Session on Goods, "the Manufacture of Great Britain, exported to "any Place within the Streights of Gibraltar," it is declared to be expedient to permit Goods and Merchandize to be imported from the Levant, un-der certain Regulations and Reftrictions, without having been opened and aired in the Lazarets of any of the Ports or Places mentioned in an Act, paffed in the Twenty-fixth Year of His late Majefty King George the Second, intituled " An Act for en-George the Second, intituled "An Act for en-"larging and regulating the Trade into the Levant "Seas." And it is enacted, That it shall be law-ful to and for His Majesty, his Heirs and Suc-cessors, by and with the Advice of his or their Privy Council, by any Order or Orders to be issued from Time to Time, to grant Licence and Permis-fion for the Importation into Great Britain, or the Usands of Guernsey. Iersey. Alderney, Sark or Islands of Guernsey, Jersey, Alderney, Sark or Man, of all Goods, Wares, and Merchandizes, coming from the Levant Seas, without clean Bills of Health, without fuch Goods and Merchandizes having been opened and aired in the Lazarets of any of the Places mentioned in the faid recited Act; and that all fuch Goods and Merchandizes fhall and may be admitted to an Entry in any of the Ports of Great Britain, or the faid Islands of Guernfey, Jerfey, Alderney, Sark or Man, fubject, neverthelefs, to fuch Regulations, Rules, Orders, and Directions, with refpect to opening and airing fuch Creads and Marchaelicar provides the fuch Goods and Merchandizes previous to the landing thereof, and to the Performance of Quarantine by the Crews or other Perfors belonging to or being on board of the Ships or Veffels in which fuch Goods or Merchandizes shall be imported, as His Majesty, by and with the Advice of his Privy Council, shall by any Order or Orders to be issued as aforefaid, make, prefcribe, or direct ; any Law,

Statute, or Ufage to the contrary notwithftanding; And whereas His Majefty has been pleafed, by his Order in Council, bearing Date the Twenty-fifth of September laft, to direct, That all Ships and Veffels, Perfons, Goods, and Merchandize, which were then arrived, or fhould thereafter arrive, from the Levant, at any Port or Place of this Kingdom, or the Ifles of Guernfey, Jerfey, Alderney, Sark or Man, without clean Bills of Health, and without having performed Quarantine in any of the Ports of the Mediterranean mentioned in the above recited Act, paffed in the Twenty-fixth Year of His late Majefty King George the Second ; and all Ships and Veffels, Perfons, Goods, and Merchandizes whatfoever, liable to Quarantine, and not being furnifhed with clean Bills of Health, from whatever Port or Place the fame fhould come, fhould (until further Order) perform their Quarantine for the Term mentioned in the faid Order in Standgate Creek, and no where elfe : His Majefty, by and with the Advice of his Privy Council, is hereby pleafed to order, that the following provifional Regulations be (until further Order) obferved with refpect to the due Performance of Quarantine, by all fuch Ships and the Crews, or other Perfons belonging to or on board the faid Ships; and with refpect to the unpacking, opening, and airing of all the Goods of different Defcriptions, imported in Ships arriving without clean Bills of Health.

That as foon as any fuch Ship fhall arrive, the Mafter and Mate fhall immediately proceed in their own Boat (which Boat fhall be attended by a Guard Boat) to certain Huts or Tents to be erected on the Beach, for the Purpole of undergoing the neceffary Examinations; and in addition to the ufual printed Quarantine Queflions, the Superintendant or, Superintendants of Quarantine in Standgate Creek fhall make the following Enquiries, which fhall be anfwered feparately by the Mafter and Mate. viz.

- Ift, Was the Cargo taken in at more than One Port; and if fo, declare what Part was taken in at each Place?
- 2d, Were there any Letters, Parcels, or other Articles delivered to, or received from any Ship or Veffel met with on the Paffage, and what were fuch Letters, Parcels, or other Articles, refpectively ?

3d, Does the Whole of the Crew and Paffengers confilt of the fame Individuals that were on board at the Time or Times of Departure from the Port or Ports of Loading respectively; and if any Change or Alteration has taken place, point out the same, and the Circumstances which occasioned it?

4th, Has any of the Crew, Paffengers, or any other Perion whatfoever, died on board the Ship during the Voyage, or been fick or ill of any Diforder whatfoever.

That the Anfwers of the Mafter and Mates refpectively be taken down in Writing, and the Bills of Health, Manifefts of the Cargo, and all Letters and Packets, be then and there delivered to the Superintendant or Superintendants of Quarantine, and depofited in a Veffel with Vinegar, and from thence taken out with a Pair of Tongs, and dried in the Smoaking Cafe : and all Packets containing Inclofures shall be previously flit on the Sides by the Mafter or Mate, fo as to admit of their being completely foaked and fumigated, and shall remain in the Smoaking Cafe from Twelve to Twenty Hours, at the Diferetion of the Superintendant or Superintendants ; and if amongst the Parcels there are any that contain more than Papers, fuch Parcels shall be fent to the Hulks, or Lazarets, and be fubjected to the fame Quarantine as the Cargo.

That after fuch Examinations shall be completed, the Master and Mate of the Ship or Vessel shall return on board, and shall become subject to Quarantine until further Order.

That in cafe it shall appear from the above Examinations, and the Report made to the Commiffioners of the Cuftoms by the Superintendant or Superintendants, of Quarantine and the Medical Affiftants, and from the Bills of Health, and the Manifest of the Cargo, that there is no Reason to apprehend Danger of Infection, the Pilots who may have been taken on board to conduct the Ship from the Downs (or elfewhere) to Standgate Creek, shall be permitted to go on board the Ship appointed for an Holpital Ship, or to go on Shore to a Hut or Fent confiructed on the Beach, and provided with Necessaries for their Reception, and shall there per-form a Quarantine of Four Days; at the Expiration of which the faid Pilots, if they continue free from Appearance of Infection, shall be fumigated and discharged from Quarantine : provided always, that during this Performance of Quarantine the faid Pilots shall not have Communication with any other Perfons; in Default of which fuch Pilots shall be

detained under Quarantine until further Order. That after the Pilots shall have been permitted to quit the Ships, all the Boats belonging to such Ships shall be holited out, and delivered into the Custody of the Superintendant or Superintendants of Quarantine, who shall cause the faid Boats to be moored at a Distance from the Ship; and unless from Circumstances of absolute Necessity, the faid Boats shall not be returned until the Ships and Crews are admitted to Pratique.

That not any Thing whatever be delivered from on board the Ships without an Order from the Superintendant or Superintendants.

That nothing, however infufceptible of Infection, be conveyed from one Ship to another, nor any perfunal Intercourfe permitted from Ship to Ship. That the Guards who may be placed on board a Ship under Quarantine do accompany, when required, the Lighters and the Boats belonging to fuch Ship, to prevent any Communication in the Transit of the Cargo from the Ship to the Lazaret.

of the Cargo from the Ship to the Lazaret. That they do take care, that no Remnants of Cotton, or other Articles fusceptible of Infection, remain in the Lighters, but do collect and deliver the fame into the Lazarets with the laft Package.

That they do take care after the Difcharge of the Cargoes into the Lazarets, that the Holds and between Decks of the Ships be completely fwept, and the Sweepings be burned.

That they fearch diligently the Lockers, Chefts, &c. of the Officers, Fallengers, and Crews, and every Part of the Ships, fo that nothing remain undelivered to the Lazarets fulceptible of Infection, but what is abfolutely requilite for daily Ufe; and do fee that the Chefts, Clothes, and Bedding be daily opened and aired.

That they do make daily Report to the Superintendant or Superintendants and the Medical Affiltants, as to the State of Health of every Person on board; and whether the Regulations of Quarantine are properly complied with.

That in cafe any Impediment occurs in the Execution of thefe Duties, Notice be immediately given to the Mafter of the Ship in the first Instance; and if thereupon such Impediment be not instantly removed, to the Superintendant or Superintendants of Quarantine.

That the Paffengers on board all fuch Ships do perform their Quarantine in like Manner, and for the fame Period of Time as the Crews, unlefs they are defirous of performing it in other Veffels to be hired at their own Expence, in which Cafe they fhall be liable to a Quarantine of Fourteen Days, and at the Expiration thereof, if they continue free from Infection, they fhall be fumigated and difcharged.

charged. That after the Pilots and the Puffengers (provided the latter perform their Quara time in a feparate Veffel) have quitted the Ships in which they arrived, the Hatches of fuch Ships shall be opened, and the probationary Airing of the Cargo shall commence, in Manner following, that is to fay; Such a Number of Bales of the enumerated Goods

Such a Number of Bales of the enumerated Goods as can be ranged upon the Decks of the Ships importing the fame, fhall be holfted up and ripped open, to as to admit of the Contents of fuch Bales being handled or rummaged by the Crews, and under fuch Procels fhall remain open for Three Days, and on the Fourth Day fhall be fewed up and fent to the Hulks or Lazarets in which they are to perform Quarantine, in the Long Boats belonging to the Ships, or in Lighters conducted by the Crews of the Ships, attended by a Guard Boat; and as foon as the Deck is cleared of the Firit Parcel of Goods, a Second Parcel fhall be holfted up and treated in the like Manner for the Space of 'Two Days; after which a Third Parcel in Succefilon fhall be holfted up and treated in the fame Manner for the Space of One Day; but in cafe of any fulficious Circumflances arifung, the probationary Airing fhall be extended and prolonged as the Cafe may require.

tended and prolonged as the Cafe may require. That when the the probationary Airing has been completed, provided the Crews and Paffengers on board continue free from any Appearance of In-

fection, the Superintendant or Superintendants of Quarantine shall permit the Ship or Vessel under Quarantine to be hauled alonglide the Hulks or Lazarets, into which the Reft of the enumerated Goods of every Defcription, and the non-enumerated Goods which may be packed in Packages fulceptible of Infection, shall be deposited, to be there opened and aired for the Time hercinafter ex. prefied; and the Ships, together with the non-enu-merated Goods which may be packed in Packages not susceptible of Infection shall depart from the Hulks or Lazarets to a proper Diftance, and shall there commence a Quarantine of Twenty Days, at the Expiration of which (if all the Perfons on board continue free from Appearance of Infection) the Ships shall be fumigated and discharged.

That no more than One Ship, Boat, or Veffel of any Kind shall be permitted to be alongside the Hulks or Lazarets at the fame Time.

That the following Goods be opened, unpacked, and aired on board the Hulks or Lazarets (unlefs His Majesty shall, by His Order in Council, think fit to direct otherwife) for the Space of Forty Days, viz.

Hemp and Flax, Paper or Books, Silk raw, thrown, or wrought; Linen, Cotton Wool, Cotton Yarn, or manufactured ; Wool, raw, or anywife wrought; Feathers, Grogram, or Mohair Yarn, Human Hair, Goats Hair, Carmenia Wool, Carpets, Camblets, Burdets, or other Manufactures of Silk and Cotton; Kid Skins, and Skins in the Wool or Hair; Spunges, Wine and Oil in Cheits; Thread Stockings; Straw Hats and Brufhes; Matting; and Artificial Flowers.

That all non-enumerated Goods, except fuch as are packed in Wood, Glass, or Metal, shall be opened and aired on board the Hulks or Lazarets for the Space of Twenty Days, and that all non-enumerated Goods, flowed loofe, or packed in Wood, Glafs, or Metal, shall be opened and aired on board the Ships in which they arrive, and shall continue under Quarantine until the Ships are discharged.

That when the Goods are received on hoard the Hulks or Lazarets, care be taken to place them feparately from Goods previoufly under Quarantine; and that the non-enumerated Goods be flowed apart from the enumerated Goods of the fame Cargoes.

That the enumerated Goods be flowed in fuch Manner as to admit of complete Perflation and Change of Air, and the Bales to have a Seam ripped open all down one Side, and the Porters to thrust in their naked Hands and Arms for Twenty Days fucceflively; after which the Bales to be fewed up and turned over, and the other Side unripped and managed in the fame Manner for the Space of Twenty

Days more, which shall complete the Quarantine. That a small Vessel, provided with One or more Affidants, and with proper Necessaries for the Reception of Sick Perfons, be flationed in Standgate Creek : that the Northernmost Corner of Chetney-Hill, a Space of Ground of One Hundred and Fifty Feet, be immediately inclosed and fenced, fo as to admit of being fecurely guarded to prevent Efcape or Communication; and that Three small Cabins of Wood, not lefs than Twenty Feet diftant from each other, about Twelve or Fifteen Feet fquare, calculated to hold One Person cach; and furnished with proper Necessfaries, be erected on Shore near the Captain William Molesworth Madden, vice Conran.

Beach, with a Door on each of the Four Sides, fo that the Sick Perfon may always be approached on the Windward Side by those who administer Nourifhment and Relief to them.

That the Superintendants, and no other Perfons, shall fupply Perfoss and Ships in Quarantine with Provisions and other Necessaries ; and all Communication to be carried on by Daylight.

And the Lords Commiffioners of His Majefty's Treafury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Master General, and the Principal Öfficers of the Ordnance, His Majefty's Secretary at War, and the Governors or Commanders in Chief for the Time being of the faid respective Isles of Jerfey, Guernfey, Alderney, Sark and Man, are to give the necessary Directions herein; as to them may refpectively appertain.

feveral Artificers and Manufacturers, Subjetts of Ass Jeveral Artificers and Wanujacturers, Subjects of Great Britain, have, from Time to Time, gone into Foreign Countries to exercife their feveral Callings, contrary to the Laws of thefe Kingdoms, the follow-ing Abstrails of Atts of Parliament of Their late Majesties King George the First and Second, and of His profest Majeston for presenting Gold Parlia His prefent Majefty, for preventing fuch Practices, are published, for the Information of all Perfons who may be ignorant of the Penalties they may incur by Difobedience to them: And it will be observed, that fuch Penalties likewife extend to those who are any ways concerned or instrumental in the Sending or Enticing Artificers or Manufacturers out of thefe Kingdoms, or in the Exportation of the Tools and Inflruments used by them, as well as to the Artificers or Manufagurers themselves.

### Statute 5 George I. Chap. 27.

IF any Perfon shall contract with, entice, or folicit, any Artificer in Wool, Iron, Steel, Brafs, or other Metal, Clock-maker, Watch-maker, or any other Artificer of Great Britain, to go into Foreiga Countries out of the King's Dominions, and shall be convicted thereof, upon Indictment or Informa-tion in any of the Courts at Westminster, or at the Affizes or Quarter Seffions, he fhall be fined any Sum not exceeding ONE HUNDRED POUNDS for the first Offence, and shall be imprisoned Three Months, and till the Fine be paid. And if any Perfon having been once convicted shall offend again, he shall be fined at the Difcretion of the Court, and imprifoned Twelve Months, and till the Fine be paid.

If any of the King's Subjects, being fuch Artificers, shall go into any Country out of His Ma1245

jefty's Dominions, to exercise or teach the faid. Frades to Foreigners; and if any of the King's Subjects in any fuch Foreign Country, exercifing any of the faid Trades, fhall not return into this Realm within Six Months after Warning given by the Ambailador, Miniller, or Conful of Great Britain, in the Country where fuch Artificers shall be, or by any Perfon authorifed by fuch Ambaffador, &c. or by one of the Secretaries of State, and from henceforth inhabit within this Realm; fuch Perfons shall be incapable of taking any Legacy, or of being an Executor or Administrator, or of taking any Lands, &c. within this Kingdom, by Defcent, Devile, or Purchafe, and shall forfeit all Lands, Goods, &c. within this Kingdom, to His Majefty's Use, and shall be deemed Alien, and out of His Majefty's Protection.

Upon Complaint made, upon Oath, before any Juffice of Peace, that any Perfon is endeavour-ing to feduce any fuch Artificer, or that any fuch Artificer hath contracted or is preparing to go out of His Majefty's Dominions, for the Purpofes afore-faid, fuch Jultice may fend his Warrant to bring the Perfon complained of before him, or before fome other Juffice; and if it shall appear by the Oath of One Witnefs, or by Confession, that he was guilty of any of the faid Offences, fuch Juftice may bind him to appear at the next Affizes or Quarter Seftions: And if fuch Perfon shall refufe to give Security, the Justice may commit him to Gaol till the next Affizes or Quarter Seffions, and until he shall be delivered by due Courfe of Law. And if any fuch Artificer shall be convicted, upon Indictment, of any fuch Promife, Contract, or Preparation to go beyond the Seas, for the Purpole aforefaid, he shall give fuch Security to the King not to depart out of His Majefty's Dominions, as fuch Court shall think reafonable, and shall be imprisoned till Security given.

If any of the above Offences shall be committed in Scotland, the fame shall be profecuted in the Court of Jufficiary or the Circuits there.

### Statute 23 George II. Chap. 13.

IF any Perfon shall contract with, or endeavour to feduce any Artificer in Wool, Mohair, Cotton, or Silk, or in Iron, Steel, Brafs, or other Metal, or any Clock-maker, Watch-maker, or any other Artificer in any other of the Manufac-tures of Great Britain or Ireland, to go out of this Kingdom or Ireland into any Foreign Coun-try not within the Dominions of the Crown of Great Britain, and fhall be convicted, upon Indictment or Information, in the Kings Bench at Westminster, or by Indictment at the Affizes or General Gaol Delivery for the County, &c. wherein fuch Offence shall be committed in England, or by Indictment in the Court of Jufficiary or any of the Circuit Courts in Scotland, or by Indictment or Information in the King's Bench at Dublin, if fuch Offence be committed in Ireland; the Perfon fo convicted shall, for every Ar-tificer contracted with or leduced, forteit FIVE HUNDRED POUNDS, and shall fuffer Impri-fonment in the Common Gaol of the County or Stewartry wherein fuch Offeuder shall be convicted for Twelve Calendar Months, and until Forfeiture be paid : And in cafe of a fubfequent Offence of Iron Manufactures of this Kingdom, or any Part

the fame Kind, the Perfons fo again offending hall forfeit, for every Perfon contracted with or feduced, ONE THOUSAND POUNDS, and hall fuffer Impriforment in the Common Gaol of the County or Stewartry wherein fuch Offender shall be convicted, for Two Years, and until fuch Forfeiture be paid.

If any Perfon in Great Britain or Ireland shall put on board any Ship or Boat, not bound directly to fome Port in Great Britain or Ireland, or to fome other of the Dominions of the Crown of Great Britain, any fuch Tools or Utenfils as are commonly ufed in, or proper for the Preparing, Working up, or Finishing of the Woollen or Silk Manufactures, or any Part of fuch Tools, he shall, for every Of-fence, forfeit all fuch Tools, or Parts thereof, put on board, and TWO HUNDRED POUNDS; to be recovered by Action of Debt, &c. in any Court of Record at Westminster, or in the Court of Sef-sion in Scotland, or at any of the Four Courts in Dublin refpectively, wherein no Effoin, &c. shall-be allowed.
