By the KING. PROCLAMATION,

For giving Currency to a new Coinage of Copper Money, of Two-penny and One-penny Pieces, Halfpenny Pieces and Farthings.

GEORGE R.

WHEREAS in Consequence of the unanimous Address of our Commons of Great Britain in Parliament assembled, We thought fit to order that certain Pieces of Copper should be coined, which should go and pass for One Penny and Two Pennies, and that each of such Pieces of Cae Penny should weigh One Ounce Avoirdupois, and that each of such Two-penny Pieces should weigh Two Ounces Avoirdupois, the intrinsic Value of such Pieces of One Penny and Two Pennies. of fuch Pieces of One Penny and Two Pennies, Workmanship included, corresponding as nearly as possible with the nominal Value of the same respecpointie with the nominal value of the lame respectively; every such Picce having on one Side thereof Our Estigies or Portraiture, with Our Name or Title, and on the Reverse, the Figure of Britannia, represented sitting on a Rock in the Sea, holding a Trident in her Left Hand, and a Branch of Olive in her Right Hand, with the Year of our Lord: And whereas Penny and Two-penny Pieces of Copper of the Weight and Description aforesaid having been coined accordingly, We did, with the Advice of Our Privy Council, by Our Royal Proclamation, bearing Date the Twenty-fixth Day of July in the Thirty-feventh Year of Our Reign, ordain, declare, and command, That such Pieces of Copper Money should be current and lawful Money of Our Kingdom of Great Britain, and should pass and he received as current and lawful Money of Our faid Kingdom, that is to say, such Penny Pieces as of the Value of One Penny, and such Two-penny Pieces as of the Value of Two Pennies, in all Pay-ments and Transactions of Money; provided that no Person should be obliged to take more of such Copper Money, in any One Payment, than should be of the Value of One Shilling, after the Rate aforesaid: And whereas We have since caused great Quantities of such Penny and Two-penny Pieces be coined and delivered, and We have also thought fit to order, That Halfpenny Pieces and Farthings should be coined, having also on one Side thereof

Our Effigies or Portraiture, with Our Name or Title, and on the Reverle the Figure of Britannia, with the Year of our Lord; all which Two-penny Pieces, One-penny Pieces, Halfpenny Pieces, and Farthings, have been coined by Matthew Boulton, of Soho, in the County of Warwick, Efquire; and We do intend, from Time to Time, as Occasion shall require, to order like Two-penny Pieces, One-penny Pieces, Halfpenny Pieces, and Farthings, or penny Pieces of them. some or one of them, to be coined in like Manner, and to be delivered at such Times and in such Quantities as We shall find to be necessary for the Purposes of Circulation: We have therefore, with the Advice of Our Privy Council, thought fit to iffue this Our Royal Proclamation; and We do hereby ordain, declare, and command, That all fuch Pieces of Copper Money, so already coined and is-fued, and which shall hereafter be coined and issued as aforesaid, shall be current and lawful Money of Our Kingdom of Great Britain, and shall pass and be received as current and lawful Money of Our said Kingdom, (that is to fay); fuch Two-penny Pieces as of the Value of Two Pence, and fuch Penny Pieces as of the Value of One Penny; fuch Half-pence as of the Value of One Halfpenny, and fuch Farthings as of the Value of One Farthing: Provided that no Person shall be obliged to take more of such Two-penny and One-penny Pieces, in any one Payment, than shall be of the Value of One Shilling, after the Rate aforefaid; or to take more of fuch Halfpenny and Farthing Pieces, in any one Payment, than shall be of the Value of Sixpence, after the Rate aforefaid.

of Gunpowder, or any Sort of Arms and Ammunition; and also to empower His Majesty to restrain "the carrying Coastwise of Saltpetre, Gunpowder, " or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition."-And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Master General of the Ordnance, and His Majesty's Secretary at War, are to give the necessary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain. And the May Brig belonging to Guernsey, that had been captured by the Providence French Privateer on the 3d Instant, and recaptured the following Morning by His Majesty's Sloop Suffisante off the Isle of Bas, arrived here last Evening; and the Prize-Master informs me he left the Suffisante of the Prize-Master informs me he left the Suffisante in Chace of the Privateer, with every Prospect of fpeedily coming up with her.

E. distant Five Leagues, after a Chace of Six Hours, captured L'Heureuse Esperance French Lugger Privateer, of St. Maloes, mounting Fourteen Three-Pounders, Eight of which were thrown overboard before we came up with her. She had on board but Twenty-four Men, having manned Four Prizes fince the Commencement of this Cruize. She is a remarkably fait Sailer, and has done a great deal of Mischief to the English Trade. The Enemy had a Man killed and Seven wounded, without, I am hapy to add, having done us any Damage.
