Council, upon Pain of incurring the Forfeitures inflicted by an Act; paffed in the Thirty-third Year of His Majefty's Reign; intituled " An Act to ena" 6 ble His Majelty to relltrain the Exportation of Na" val Stores, and more effectually to prevent the Ex.." portation of Salt-Petre, Arms, and Ammunition, "s when prohibited by Proclamation or Order in "Council." But it is, neverthelefs, His Majetty's Pleafure, that nothing herein contained fhall extend, or be confrued to extend, to any of His Majefty's Ships of War, or any other Ships or Veffels or Boats, in the Service of His Majeßty, or employed or freighted by His Majefty's Board of Orduance, or by the Commiffioners of His Ma jefly's Navy; nor to prevent any Ship or Veffel from taking or having on board fuch Quantities of Naval Stores as may be neceffary for the Ufe of fuch Ship or Veffel during the Courfe of her in. tended Voyage, or by Licence from the Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, or the Commiffioners of the Admiralty for the Time being; nor to the Exportation of the faid feveral Articles to Ireland, or to His Majety's Yards or Garrifons, or to His Majefty's Colonies or Plantations in America or the Weft Indies, or to Newfoundland, or to His Majefty's Forts and Settlements on the Coaft of Africa; or to the Ifland of St. Helena, or to the Britiff Settlements or Factories in the Eaft Indies: Provided that, upon the Exportation of any of the faid Articles, for the Purpofes of Trade, to Ireland, or to His Majefty's Yards or Garrifons, or to His Majefty's Colonies and Plantations in America or the Weft Indies, or to the Ifland of Newfoundland, or to His Majefty's Forts and Settlements on the Coalt of Africa, or to the Inland of St . Helena, or the Britifh Sectlements or Factories in the Eaft Indies, the Exporters of fuch Articles do firft make Oath of the true Deftination of the fame to the Places for which they fhall be entered Outwards, bcfore the Entry of the fame fhall be made, and do give full and fufficient Security, by Brand, to the Satisfaction of the Commiffioners of His. Majefty's Cuftoms, to carry the faid Articles to the Places for which they are fo entered Outwards, and for the Purpofes fpecified, and none other; and fuch Bond fhall not be cancelled or delivered up, until Proof be made, to the Satisfaction of the faid Commiffioners, by the Production, within a Time to be fixed by the faid Conmiffioners, and fpecified in the Bond, of a Certificate or Certificates, in fuch Form and Manner as fhall be difected by the faid Commifioners, fhewing that the faid Articles have been duly landed at the Places for which hicy were entered Outwards. And the Right Elonorable the Lords Commifioners of His Majefty's Treafury, the Commiffioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, and the Lord Warden of the Cinque

Ports, are to give the neceffary Directions herein, as to them may refpectiveiy appertain.

## A PROCLAMATION,

For giving Currency to a new Coinage of Copper Money, of Two-penny and One-penny. Pieces, Half. penny Pieces and Fartbings.

## $G E O R G E R$.

WHEREAS in Confequence of the unanimous Addrefs of our Commons of Great Britain in Parliament affembled, We thought fit to order that certain Pieces of Copper fhould be coined, which fhould go and pafs for One Penny and Two Pemnies, and that each of fuch Pieces of One Pemny flould weigh One Ounce Avoirdupois, and that each of fuch Two-penny Pieces fhould weigh Two Ounces Avoirdupois, the intrinfic Value of fuch Pieces of One Penny and Two Pennies, Workman(hip included; correfponding as nearly as poffible with the nominal Value of the fame relpectively ; every fuch Piece having on one Side thereof Our Effigies or Portraiture, with Our Name or Title, and ou the Reverfe, the Figure of Britannia, reprefented fitting on a Rock in the Sea, holding a Trident in her Left Hand, and a Branch of Olive in her Right Hand, with the Year of our Lord: And whereas Penny and Two-penny Pieces of Copper of the Weight and Defription aforefaid havo ing been coined accordingly, we did, with the Advice of Our Privy Council, by Our. Royal Procla. mation, bearing Date the Twenty-fixth Day of July in the Thirty-feventh Year of Our Reign, ordain, declare, and command, That fuch Pieces of Copper Money fhould be current and lawfil Money of Our Kingdom of Great Britain, and Chould pafs and be received as current and lawful Money of Our faid Kingdom, that is to fay, fuch Penny Fieces as of the Value of One Penny, and fuch Two-penny Pieces as of the Value of Two Pennies, in all Payments and Tranfactions of Money; provided that no Perfon fhould be obliged to take more of fuch Copper Money, in any One Payment, than fhould be of the Value of One Shilling, after the Rate aforefaid: And whereas We have fince caufed great Quantities of fuch Penny and Two-penny Pieces to be coined and delivered, and We have alfo thoughe fit to order, That Halfpenny Pieces and Farthings Thould be coined, having allo on one Side thereof Our Effigies or Portraiture, with Our Name or Title, and on the Reverfe the Figure of Britannia, with the Year of our Lord; all which Two-peniny Pieces, One penny Pieces, Halfpenny Pieces, and Farthings, have been coined by Mathew Boultor's of Soho, in the County of Warwick, Efquire ; and We do intend, from Time to Time, as Occafion fhall require, to order like Two-penny Pieces, Onepenny Pieces, Halfpenny Pieces, and Farthings, or fome or one of them, to be coined in like Manner, and to be delivered at fuch Times and in fuch Quantities as We fhall find to be ncceflary for the Purpofes of Circulation: We have thereiore, with the Advice of Our Privy Council, thought fis to iffue this Our Royal Proclamation; and We do hereby ordain, declare, and command, That all fueth Pieces of Copper Money, to already comed and if.
