NOTICE TO MARINERS.

THE Light-House erected on the Island of Anholt, being One Hundred and Twelve Feet above the Surface of the Water, so that the Fire on it, on Account of its extraordinary Height, often misleads Mariners in Point of Distance; Measures have been taken for placing a Lanthorn, at about Half the Height above-mentioned, on the East Side of the Light-House, facing the Flat and Point of Knobens; which may also be seen from a Southern and Northern Direction; but to Ships coming from a Western Direction it will not be visible, being covered by the Light-House. This Lanthorn-Fire will be lighted for the first Time on the 1st of January 1800, from which Time it will be continued every Night, in Addition to the usual Fire.

WE, His Majesty's Commissioners for managing the Stamp Duties, duly authorised by the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, pursuant to an Act of Parliament, to let to farm the Duties granted by "An Act of the Twenty fifth of His present Majesty, on Horses let to Hire for travelling Post and by Time," do hereby give Notice, that we intend to let, at our Office in Somerset-Place, the said Duties to farm, on Tuesday the 7th of January next, between the Hours of Ten and Twelve in the Forenoon, according to the Districts in the Statement under-mentioned, and to put the same up at the Sums placed opposite to each, for the Term of Three Years from the 1st Day of February next, to such Persons as may be willing to contract for the same. All Persons intending to farm the said Duties are to deliver in their Proposals to us at the Stamp-Office, in Somerset-Place, at least Three Days previous to the said 7th Day of January next, signed with their Names, stating the Places of their Abode, and specifying the District for which they intend to bid, or their Proposals cannot be proceeded on as directed by the said Act. No Persons licensed to let Horses for the Purpose of travelling Post, nor any Persons for their use, can be admitted to contract for the said Duties.
