HEREAS His Majefty hath fignified unto Us His Royal Pleafure that the Parliament of this Kingdom, which now ftands prorogued to Tuesday the 17th Day of December instant, be further prorogued to Wednelday the 15th Day of January next 1800, then to fit for the Difpatch of Bufinefs; We do therefore publish and declare that the faid Parliament be, and accordingly the faid Parliament is hereby further prorogued to Wednefday the 15th Day of January next, 1800, and the fame shall be then held at Dublin, and fit for the Difpatch of Bufinefe, whereof the Lords for the Difpatch of Bufinefs; whereof the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and the Commons in this prefent Parliament, are to take Notice, and to give their Attendance accordingly.
