Copy of a Letter from Vice-Admiral Lutwidge, Com-mander in Chief of His Majefly's Ships and Veffels in the Downes, to Evan Nepean; Efq; dated the 13th Inflant.

SIR. Beg Leave to inclose, for their Lordships' Information, a Letter from Captain Baker, of His Majefly's Ship Nemefis, acquainting me with his having captured (in Company with the Savage Sloop) the Renard Lugger Privateer, of Fourteen Guns and Sixty-five Men; and that the Savage had recaptured the Atlas, an Euglifa Brig, her Prize. I alfo inclofe a Letter from Mr. Eutcher, Mafter of the Nile (Third) Lugger, (Lieutenant Whitehead being fick on Shore, but has fince rejoined her,) acquainting me with his having captured the Pri-vateer mentioned in Captain Baker's Letter.

The Nemefis, Savage, and Nile, with the Prizes, have anchored in the Downes.

SKEFF. LUTWIDGE. I am, &c.

Nemefis, Downes, January 13, 1800. OU will be pleafed to hear of my having boarded and taken the French Privateer Lugger Le Renard, mounting Fourteen Four-Pounders, Two Swivels, with Sixty five Men, Jean Jacque Fourmintin, Maffer. She failed from Bou-logne Yefterday Moraing in Company with Six other Luggers, and had captured a Brig called the

Atlas, from Lifbon off Dungenels, but fortunately the Savage was in Company with me, and Captain The bardge was in Company with me, and Captain Thompfon quickly complying with a Signal I made him, retook the faid Brig, which I was obliged to pafs in Chace of the Lugger. I have also to inform you, that foon after I had taken Pofferfion of Le Renard, Two other Luggers were feen to Leeward. We inftantly chaced them, and came up with La Modere, a French Privateer Lugger that the Nile Hired Armed Cutter was in the act of boarding. I beg therefore to refer you to the Mafter of her for any Information you may require, as I had then no Opportunity of queffioning him, my Time being taken up in placing the Force, accidentally in Com-pany with me, in fuch a Situation to retake any other Captures that inight have been made from the Narciffus's Convoy as the patied up Channel.

Narciflus's Convoy as the patied up Channel. I accordingly gave Licutenant Guyon, of the Union Hired Armed Cutter, Orders to post him-felf off Boulogne; the Master of the Nile Lugger off Calais; and Captain Thompson, a Choice of either of those Ports his Judgment best approved. The Stag. Cutter likewise joined me during the Night, and I thought proper to give the Malter of the Directions to watch those Ports narrowly till the Morning.

the Morning. The Two Luggers and recaptured Brig being under my Charge, and having, I hope, fufficiently provided againit the, Enemy's Depredations, I thought it molt prudent to repair with them to the Downes, where I have the Honor'to inform you I arrived at Five o'Clock this Morning.

HAving had Occasion to fend His Majefty's Hired Armed Brig Ariftocrat on immediate Service, and Licutemant D'Auvergne, her Commander, having represented to me that he had very particular private Bufinefs to fettle, I committed the Execution of the Service to Lieutenant Wray, First of the Bravo: on his Return from the Execution of it he met a Privateer, of Saint Maloes, which he captured. Enclosed I have the Honor to transmit a Copy of his Report of the Circumstances for their Lord hips' Information.
