S. E. Nine Leagues. She is called I American Fig. 1. She is called L'Ayanture French Privateer, of Fourteen Guns, Four and Two Pounders, and Forty-two Men, out Ten Days from Saint Maloes, without having captured any Thing. Number of Shot I was obliged to fire before she would firike very much fhattered her Rigging, and damaged her Gaff, which prevented her getting to Windward. A heavy Gale of Wind in the Night: not having the least Prospect of reaching the Island, I made the best of my Way to this Port.
