T the Court at St. James's, the 29th of January 1800,

### PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS it has been reprefented to His Majefty at this Board, that the malignant and infectious Difeafe of the Nature of the Plague, which fome Time fince manifested itself at Philadelphia and New York, has totally ceased; His Majefty, taking the fame into Confideration, and being defirous to remove all Reftraints upon Trade, fo far as may be confistent with the Safety of his Subjects, is pleafed, by and with the Advice of his Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, That the Quarantine laid by His Majefty's Order in Council of the Sixteenth of October last upon all Ships, Perfons, Goods, and Merchandizes arriving or to arrive from Philadelphia and New York, or any Port within the State of Pennfylvania, or any Port within the Province of New York, be taken off; and that all fuch Ships and Veffels be permitted to discharge their respective Ladings without unpacking, opening, and airing, and without performing any Quarantine, at freely as they might have done in cafe fuch Order of the Sixteenth of October last had not been made, any Thing in the faid Order contained to the contrary notwithstanding: And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Mafter General of the Ordnance, His Majefty's Secretary at War, and the Governors or Commanders in Chief of the Isles of Jerfey, Guernfey, Alderney, Sark, and Man, are to give the neceffary Directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.
