SIR, Have the Pleasure to inform you, Yesterday Morning Captain Wittman, of the Sussisiante, made the Signal to chace Northward; and foon after discovered a Ship, Lugger, and Cutter steering to the S. E. At Two P. M. I recaptured the American Ship Strafford, from Baltimore bound to London, mounting Sixteen Guns. She was taken by the Lugger and Cutter above mentioned; her Cargo worth from Thirty to Forty Thousand Pounds. At Half past Two I had the Pleasure of feeing the Lugger strike to the Suffisante; and I have every Reason to believe, from the Suffisante's excellent Sailing, that the Cutter is now in Captain Wittman's Possession.
