Phabe, at Sea, February 27, 1800. Have to acquaint you, that on the 21st Instant, His Majesty's Ship under my Command captured the French Ship Privateer Bellegarde, of Four-teen Guns and One Hundred and Fourteen Men, belonging to St. Maloes; she had been out Sixteen Days, and had captured the Ship Chance of London, from Martinico, and the Brig Friends of Dartmouth, from St. Michaels bound to Bristol; the former fince recaptured by His Majesty's Sloop Kangaroo

Copy of a Letter from Vice-Admiral Lutwidge, Commander in Chief of His Majelly's Ships and Veffels in the Downes, to Evan Nepean, Efq; dated the 13th Inflant.

SIR, Defire you will please to acquaint my Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, that I this Morning received the enclosed Letter from Captain Galway, of His Majesty's Sloop Plover, informing me of his having, on the 10th Instant, captured the French Lugger Privateer Massena, carrying Four Three-Pounders and Thirty-four Men.

The Privateer arrived in the Downs this I am, Sir, &c. &c. &c. S. LUTWIDGE, Morning.

Plover, at Sea, March 10, 1800. Have the pleasure to acquaint you that I captured this Morning, after a Chace of an Hour, the French Privateer Massena, (off Dunkirk,) Ber-nard Avril, Commander, mounting Four Three-Pounders, and Thirty-four Men, sailed from Ostend Yesterday Morning, and had not made any Capture.
