The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. WHEREAS His Majesty was graciously pleased, by His Royal Proclamation bearing Date the Twenty-fixth Day of December, One thousand feven hundred and ninety-two, to promife and declare, that the Bounties of Five Pounds for every Able Seaman, and Two Pounds Ten Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, fit for His Majelty's Service, fhould be paid in the Manner thereby di-rected to every fuch Able and Ordinary Seaman, not above the Age of Fifty nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who fhould, on or before the Twenty-eighth Day of February then following, enter themfelves to ferve in His Majefty's Royal Navy, either with the Captains or Lieutenants of His Majefty's Ships or Veffels, or Officers em-ployed on Shore for railing Men for the Service of the Royal Navy: And whereas His Majefty was alfo gracioufly pleafed, by his faid Proclama-tion, to declare, that all Able-bodied Landmen, not above the Age of Thirty-five nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who should so enter themselves as aforefaid, should receive the Sum of Thirty Shillings each Man, as His Majefty's Royal Bounty : And whereas His Majefty was also gracioully pleafed, by His Royal Proclamation bearing Date the Sixteenth Day of the faid Month of February, One thousand feven hundred and ninety-three, to promife and declare, that a Reward of Twenty Shillings for every Able and Ordinary Seaman fit to ferve on board His Majefty's Ships, should be paid to any Person who should differer any Seaman or Seamen who might conceal him or themfelves, fo that such Seaman or Seamen should be taken for His Majeity's Service, on or before the Thirtieth Day of April then next, by any of His Majefty's Sea Officers appointed to raife Men on Shore, or by the Captains or Commanders of any of His Majefty's Ships or Veffels in the Ports, or on the Coafts of this Kingdom: And whereas the Time limited by the faid Proclamations for Payment of the faid Bounties and Reward hath been prolonged

P R E S E N T, KINC's Molt Excellent Majefty in Council His Privy Council, doth therefore order, and it is hereby accordingly ordered, that the Time limited for Payment of the faid Bounties and Reward be prolonged and extended from the faid Thirty-first Day of this instant March to the Thirtieth Day of June next inclusive: Whereof all Perfons concerned are to take Notice, and go-Steph. Penelope, off Oid Malaga, MY LORD, Jan. 26, 1800. Have the Honor to inform your Lordship, that I this Day captured the Carmen, a Spanish Xebeck Corvette, commanded by Don Eflevanno Joel Bar-cello, mounting Sixteen Four-Pounders and Four Swivels, and manned with One Hundred and Thirty Men; fhe had been Four Days out from Malaga, and had not made any Captures.
