Dublin-Caflle, March 24, 1800. HIS Day His Excellency the Lord Lieute-nant went in State to the House of Peers, and being feated on the Throne with the ufual Solemnity, Bryan Connor, Yeoman Usher of the Black Rod, was fent with a Message from His Excellency to the Houfe of Commons, fignifying his Pleafure that they should immediately attend His Excellency in the House of Peers. The Commons being come thither accordingly, His Excellency gave the Royal Affent to '

An Act for granting to His Majelty, his Heirs and Succeffors, feveral Duties therein mentioned, to be levied by the Commissioners for managing the Stamp Duties.

An Act for granting to His Majefty, His Heirs and Succeffors, certain Duties and Rates upon the Portage and Conveyance of all Letters and Packets within this Kingdom.

An Act for the better Collection of all Duties on Hides and Skins tanned and dreffed in Oil, and on Vellum and Parchment made in Ireland; and for preventing Frauds on His Majefty's Revenue therein.

An Act for enabling His Majesty to accept the Services of Volunteers from the Militia under certain Refirictions, and for amending the Law relative to the Militia of Ireland.

An A& for punishing Mutiny and Defertion, and for the better Payment of the Army and their Quarters within this Kingdom.

An AA to prohibit the making of Malt and diftilling of Spirits in this Kingdom for a limited Time.

An AA to revive, with Amendments, an AA paffed last Session of Parliament, intituled An A& for the Suppreffion or the Rebellion which still unhappily exilts within this Kingdom, and for the Protection of the Perfons and Properties of His Majefty's faithful Subjects within the fame. An Act for the Relief of Perfons who have

omitted to qualify themfelves according to Law.
