SIR,

I Have the Pleasure to inform you, that after a Chace of Eight Hours I this Day, at Quarter past Twelve at Noon, captured a Spanish Ship Privateer, of Sixteen Guns (Six of which she hove overboard during the Chace) and Ninety Men; proves to be the Corunefa, of and from Corunna Fifteen Days, commanded by Robert Tortau; has captured during his Cruize the Brigs named at the Bottom hereof.

THIS Day His Excellency the Lord Lieutenant went in State to the House of Peers, and being seated on the Throne with the usual Solemnity, Bryan Connor, Yeoman Usher of the Black Rod, was sent with a Message from His Excellency to the House of Commons, signifying his Pleasure that they should immediately attend His Excellency in the House of Peers. The Commons being come thither accordingly, His Excellency gave the Royal Assent to

An Act for ascertaining the Stock of Foreign Wines belonging to Dealers in and Sellers of such Wines on the 25th of March 1800, and for securing certain Duties of Excise thereon, and for granting to His Majesty a further Duty on Rum imported, and certain Duties on the Exportation of certain Goods to the British Plantations in America and the West Indies in Lieu of all other Duties.

An Act for granting to His Majesty, His Heirs, and Successors, several Duties therein-mentioned, to be levied by the Commissioners for managing the Stamp Duties.

An Act for defraying the Charge of the Pay and Clothing of the Militia for One Year, from the Twenty-fifth Day of March One thousand eight hundred.

An Act for regulating the Payment of Bounties on the Exportation of certain Manufactures of this Kingdom.

An Act for further continuing an Act, intituled An Act for facilitating the Trade and Intercourse between this Kingdom and the United States of America.

An Act to continue an Act passed in the Thirty-sixth Year of His present Majesty's Reign, intituled An Act to explain and amend an Act passed in the Nineteenth and Twentieth Years of His Majesty's Reign, intituled An Act for the better Regulation of the Silk Manufacture.

An Act to continue an Act passed in the Thirty-sixth Year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled An Act for continuing and amending the several Acts for the further Improvement and Extension of the Fisheries on the Coasts of this Kingdom.



An Act to enact, that Part of an Act passed in the Parliament of England in the Eighth Year of Richard the Second, shall not continue to be of Force in this Kingdom, any Law to the contrary notwithstanding.

An Act to empower the Lord Lieutenant or other Chief Governor or Governors of Ireland to apprehend and detain such Persons as he or they shall suspect for conspiring against His Majesty's Person and Government.

An Act for continuing an Act passed in the Thirty-third Year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, An Act for establishing Regulations respecting Aliens arriving in this Kingdom or resident therein, in certain Cases, and Subjects of this Kingdom who have served or are serving in foreign Armies; and for continuing another Act passed in the Thirty-sixth Year of His present Majesty's Reign, intituled An Act to prevent the Importation of Arms, Gunpowder, and Ammunition into this Kingdom, and making and removing, selling and keeping of Gunpowder, Arms, and Ammunition without Licence.
