Extract of a Letter from Vice-Admiral Sir Thomas Pasley, Bart. Commander in Chief of His Majesty's Ships and Vessels at Plymouth, to Evan Nepean, Esq; dated the 20th Instant.

ENCLOSED is a Letter from the Commander of the Spitfire, stating his having captured the French Privateer Brig therein-mentioned.

His Majesty's Sloop Spitfire, Plymouth-Sound, April 20, 1800.

SIR,
I Have the Honor to acquaint you, that at Four A. M. on the 17th Instant, the Bolt-Head, bearing N. distant Nine Leagues, Chace was given to a Brig to the Eastward, in which at Seven, a Guernsey Brig Privateer joined, and at Nine (for an Hour) His Majesty's Ship Diamond, the former being left Hull down a-stern, at Eleven gave over the Pursuit, and both were out of Sight at Noon, when the Telegraph from under Alderney crossed on her, and having exchanged a Broadside with her, dropped a-stern and joined us, but the Spitfire having distanced her also, at Two P. M. Cape Levy, bearing S. S. W. distant Four Leagues, brought too the Chace, which proved to be L'Heureuse Société of Pleinpont, carrying Fourteen Guns and Sixty-four Men, a new Vessel, out Three Days, but had not made any Capture.




