In purfuance of your Order I failed on the 19th Instant, and took my Station off the Vlie Passage on the 21st at Half past Six A: M. At the Entrance of that Paffage I discovered a French Cutter Privateer in Shore of me, which I chaled and came up with, and who, after exchanging a few Shot, ran on Shore. I am forry to add I was not able to get Men enough to him, as totally to deftroy him : a Nentral Veffel that came out of the Vlie Paffage the 23d Inftant, informed me fhe mounted Ten Guns, and had Thirty-fix Men on board; and that he had, after getting off proceeded to the Texel Road by the Inner Navigation.

On the 25th at Two P. M. I chased and came up with a French Cutter Privateer, who, after engaging me a little while, ran on Shore on the Vlie Ifland, where he defended himfelf pretty well for an Hour, when I perceived his Men were escaping to the Shore under the Cover and Protection of Troops to the Amount of about an Hundred. I immediately hoifted out my fmall Boat, and directed my larger one to follow, and, under the Fire of the Musketry from the Troops on Shore, boarded her, but not until the Crew had efcaped : in our Endeavours to get the Cutter off we were confiderably annoyed by the Fire from the Troops; but having detached the large Boat further in Shore, I fucceeded in diflodging them from the Sand Bank, behind which they had taken Shelter, and I was fortunate enough to get the Privateer off. She is called the Impregnable, mounts Fourteen Guns, Twelve of which are Three-Pounders, and Two are Nine-Pounders. She had on board during the Engagement about Sixty Men, as appears by her Log; and it also appears the had been particularly fuccefsful during her former Cruizes. The Lark has fuffered in her Hull and Rigging, but fortunately had no Man killed or wounded :--the Enemy we have Reafon to fuppole, from the State of the Veffel, fuffered confiderably; and feveral Men were killed on the Beach. I cannot fpeak too highly of Mr. Thomas Gettins the Master, as alfo the good Conduct and Bravery of the Crew of the Lark.

As feveral Artificers and Manufacturers, Subjects of Great Britain, have, from Time to Time, gone into Foreign Countries to exercise their several Callings, contrary to the Laws of these Kingdoms, the following Abstracts of Acts of Parliament of Their late Majesties King George the First and Second, and of His prefent Majesty, for preventing such Practices, are published, for the Information of all Persons who may be ignorant of the Penalties they may incur by Difobedience to them : And it will be observed, that fuch Penalties likewife extend to those who are any ways concerned or inftrumental in the Sending or Enticing Artificers or Manufacturers out of thefe Kingdoms, or in the Exportation of the Tools and Instruments used by them, as well as to the Artificers or Manufacturers themselves.

Statute 5 George I. Chap. 27.

F any Perfon shall contract with, entice, or folicit, any Artificer in Wool, Iron, Steel, Brafs, or Great Britain, and shall be convicted, upon In-other Metal, Clock-maker, Watch-maker, or any dictment or Information, in the Kings Bench at

other Artificer of Great Britain, to go into Foreign Countries out of the King's Dominions, and fhall be convicted thereof, upon Indictment or Informa-tion in any of the Courts at Weltminster, or at the Affizes or Quarter Seffions, he shall be fined any Sum not exceeding ONE HUNDRED POUNDS for the first Offence, and shall be imprisoned Three Months, and till the Fine be paid. And if any Perfon having been once convicted shall offend again, he shall be fined at the Difcretion of the Court, and imprifoned Twelve Months, and till the Fine be paid.

If any of the King's Subjects, being fuch Artificers, shall go into any Country out of His Majesty's Dominions, to exercise or teach the faid Trades to Foreigners; and if any of the King's Subjects in any fuch Foreign Country, exercifing ny of the faid Trades, fhall not return into this Realm within Six Months after Warning given by the Ambaffador, Minister, or Conful of Great Britain, in the Country where fuch Artificers shall be, or by any Perfon authorifed by fuch Amballador, &c. or by one of the Secretaries of State, and from henceforth inhabit within this Realm; fuch Perfons shall be incapable of taking any Legacy, or of being an Executor or Administrator, or of taking any Lands, &c. within this Kingdom, by Descent, Devife, or Purchafe, and shall forfeit all Lands, Goods, &c. within this Kingdom, to His Majefty's Ule, and shall be deemed Alien, and out of His Majefty's Protection.

Upon Complaint made, upon Oath, before any Juffice of Peace, that any Perfon is endeavour-ing to feduce any fuch Artificer, or that any fuch Artificer hath contracted or is preparing to go out of His Majefty's Dominions, for the Purpofes afore-faid, fuch Juitice may fend his Warrant to bring the Perfon complained of before him, or before jome other Juffice; and if it shall appear by the Oath of One Witnefs, or by Confession, that he was guilty of any of the faid Offences, fuch Justice may bind him to appear at the next Affizes or Quarter Seffions: And if fuch Person shall refuse to give Security, the Justice may commit him to Gaol till the next Affizes or Quarter Seffions, and until he shall be delivered by due Courfe of Law. And if any fuch Artificer shall be convicted, upon Indictment, of any fuch Promife, Contract, or Preparation to go beyond the Seas, for the Purpole aforefaid, he shall give fuch Security to the King not to depart out of His Majesty's Dominions, as such Court shall think reafonable, and shall be imprisoned till Security given.

If any of the above Offences shall be committed in Scotland, the fame shall be profecuted in the Court of Jufficiary or the Circuits there.

Statute 23 George II. Chap. 13.

IF any Perfon shall contract with, or endeavour to feduce any Artificer in Wool, Mohair, Cotton, or Silk, or in Iron, Steel, Brafs, or other Metal, or any Clock-maker, Watch-maker, or any other Artificer in any other of the Manufactures of Great Britain or Ireland, to go out of this Kingdom or Ireland into any Foreign Country not within the Dominions of the Crown of Great Britain, and shall be convicted, upon In-
