RESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. WHEREAS the Time limited by His Majefty's W Order in Council of the Thirtieth Day of October laft, prohibiting the Transporting into any Parts out of this Kingdom, any Pot-Afhes or Pearl-Afhes, (except as in the faid Order is mentioned) will expire this Day: And whereas it is judged ex-pedient that the faid Prohibition 'fhould be con-tinued for forme Time houser. His Majefty doth tinued for fome Time longer: His Majefty doth therefore, with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit, and command, That no Perfon or Perfons whofoever do, at any Time during the Space of Six Months from the Date of this Order, export, or attempt to export, transport, carry, or convey, or lade, or lay on board of any Ship, Veffel, or Boat, in order to be exported, transported, veilei, or boat, in order to be exported, transported, carried, or conveyed out of this Kingdom, any Pot-Aih or Pearl-Afh, without Leave or Per-miflion being first had and obtained from His Ma-jefty or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring the Forfeitures inflicted by an Act passed in the Thirty-fourth Year of His Majesty's Reign, initialed "An Act for indemnifying all Perfons who have " been concerned in advising or carrying into Exe-cution an Order of the Lords Commissioners of "His Majefty's Treafury refpecting the Exportation of Pot-Afhes or Pearl-Afhes; for preventing Suits in confequence of the fame; for authorizing His " Majefty to prohibit the Exportation or carrying " Coastwife of Pot-Ashes or Pearl-Ashes, and for "making further Provisions relative thereto :" But it is, nevertheless, His Majesty's Pleasure, that nothing herein contained shall extend, or be confirued to extend, to prevent the Exportation of the faid Articles to Ireland, or to His Majefty's Islands of Guernley, Jerley, Alderney, Sark, or Man, or to His Majefly's Colonies or Plantations in America or the Welt Indies, or to Newfoundland, or to His Majefty's Forts and Settlements on the Coaft of Africa, or to the Island of St. Helena, or to the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies: Provided that, upon the Exportation of the faid Articles to Ireland, or to His Majelty's Islands of Guernsey, Jersey, Alderney, Sark, or Man, or to His

Majesty's Colonies or Plantations in America or the West Indies, or to the Island of Newfoundland, or to His Majefty's Forts and Settlements on the Coaft of Africa, or to the Island of St. Helena, or to the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies, the Exporters of the faid Articles do first make Oath of the true Destination of the fame to the Places for which they shall be entered Outwards, before the Entry of the fame fhall be made; and do give full and fufficient Security, by Bond, to the Satisfaction of the Commiffioners of His Majefty's Cuftoms, to carry the faid Articles to the Places for which they are fo entered Outwards, and none other; and fuch Bond shall not be cancelled, or delivered up, until Proof be made to the Satis-faction of the faid Commissioners, by the Production, within a Time to be fixed by the faid Commiffioners, and specified in the Bond, of a Certificate or Certificates, in fuch Form and Manner as shall be directed by the faid Commillioners, flewing that the faid Articles have all been duly landed at the Places for which they were entered Outwards : And the Right Honorable the Lords Commif-And the Right Honorable the Lords Commif-fioners of His Majefty's Treafury, the Commif-fioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, and the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, are to give the neceffary Directions herein as to them may respectively apper-tain.
