P R E S E N T,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Time limited by His Majesty's Order in Council of the Thirtieth Day of October last, prohibiting the Transporting into any Parts out of this Kingdom, any Pot-Ashes or Pearl-Ashes, (except as in the said Order is mentioned) will expire this Day: And whereas it is judged expedient that the said Prohibition should be continued for some Time longer: His Majesty doth therefore, with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit, and command, That no Person or Persons whosoever do, at any Time during the Space of Six Months from the Date of this Order, export, or attempt to export, transport, carry, or convey, or lade, or lay on board of any Ship, Vessel, or Boat, in order to be exported, transported, carried, or conveyed out of this Kingdom, any Pot-Ash or Pearl-Ash, without Leave or Permission being first had and obtained from His Majesty or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring the Forfeitures inflicted by an Act passed in the Thirty-fourth Year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled "An Act for indemnifying all Persons who have been concerned in advising or carrying into Execution an Order of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury respecting the Exportation of Pot-Ashes or Pearl-Ashes; for preventing Suits in consequence of the same; for authorizing His Majesty to prohibit the Exportation or carrying Coastwise of Pot-Ashes or Pearl-Ashes, and for making further Provisions relative thereto:" But it is, nevertheless, His Majesty's Pleasure, that nothing herein contained shall extend, or be construed to extend, to prevent the Exportation of the said Articles to Ireland, or to His Majesty's Islands of Guernsey, Jersey, Alderney, Sark, or Man, or to His Majesty's Colonies or Plantations in America or the West Indies, or to Newfoundland, or to His Majesty's Ports and Settlements on the Coast of Africa, or to the Island of St. Helena, or to the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies: Provided that, upon the Exportation of the said Articles to Ireland, or to His Majesty's Islands of Guernsey, Jersey, Alderney, Sark, or Man, or to His Majesty's Colonies or Plantations in America or the

West Indies, or to the Island of Newfoundland, or to His Majesty's Ports and Settlements on the Coast of Africa, or to the Island of St. Helena, or to the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies, the Exporters of the said Articles do first make Oath of the true Destination of the same to the Places for which they shall be entered Outwards, before the Entry of the same shall be made; and do give full and sufficient Security, by Bond, to the Satisfaction of the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs, to carry the said Articles to the Places for which they are so entered Outwards, and none other; and such Bond shall not be cancelled, or delivered up, until Proof be made to the Satisfaction of the said Commissioners, by the Production, within a Time to be fixed by the said Commissioners, and specified in the Bond, of a Certificate or Certificates, in such Form and Manner as shall be directed by the said Commissioners, shewing that the said Articles have all been duly landed at the Places for which they were entered Outwards: And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, and the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, are to give the necessary Directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.

THIS Day the Lords being met, a Message was sent to the Honorable House of Commons by Sir Francis Molyneux, Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that *The Lords, authorized by virtue of His Majesty's Commission for declaring His Royal Assent to several Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate Attendance of this Honorable House in the House of Peers to hear the Commission read*; and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and several other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Acts, was read accordingly; and the Royal Assent given to

An Act for repealing so much of an Act made in the last Session of Parliament, intituled An Act for permitting certain Goods imported from the East

Indies to be warehoused, and for repealing the Duties now payable thereon, and granting other Duties in lieu thereof, as relates to Saltpetre.

An Act for defraying the Charge of the Pay and Cloathing of the Militia in that Part of Great Britain called England, for One Year from the Twenty-fifth Day of March One Thousand Eight Hundred.

An Act to enlarge the Powers of the Directors and Guardians of the Poor within the several Hundreds, Towns, and Districts in that Part of Great Britain called England, incorporated by divers Acts of Parliament, for the Purpose of the better Maintenance and Employment of the Poor, as to the Assessments to be made upon the several Parishes, Hamlets, and Places therein mentioned, until the First Day of January One Thousand Eight Hundred and Two.

An Act for increasing the Rates of Subsistence to be paid to Innkeepers and others on quartering Soldiers.

An Act for explaining and amending several Acts made in the Thirty-second Year of King Henry the Eighth, and the First, Thirteenth, and Fourteenth Years of the Reign of Queen Elizabeth, so far as respects Leaves granted by Archbishops, Bishops, Masters, and Fellows of Colleges, Deans, and Chapters of Cathedral and Collegiate Churches, Masters, and Guardians of Hospitals, and others, having any Spiritual or Ecclesiastical Living or Promotion.

An Act for the better Observance of Good Friday, in certain Cases therein mentioned.

An Act for making and maintaining of Navigable Canal from the River Thames near to the Town of Gravesend in the County of Kent to the River Medway, at a Place called Nicholfson's Ship Yard, in the Parish of Frindsbury in the said County, and also a certain Collateral Cut from White Wall in the said Parish to the said River Medway.

An Act for amending the several Acts passed for making, extending, finishing, and completing the Canal Navigation from Manchester, to or near Ashton-under-Lyne and Oldham, and the several Cuts and other Works authorized to be made and done by the Company of Proprietors of the said Canal Navigation, and for granting to the said Company further and other Powers.

An Act for lighting the Street and Lanes of the Borough of Berwick-upon-Tweed, and the Quays and Wharfs belonging to the said Borough, and that Part of the Bridge over the River Tweed which lies within the Liberties of said Borough, and also the Street of Castlegates, within the said Borough of the Liberties thereof, and for paving the Foot-Paths of the Streets of the said Borough, and of Castlegate aforesaid, and for preventing Obstructions, Nuisances, and Annoyances therein.

An Act to alter, explain, amend, and render more effectual an Act passed in the Twenty-ninth Year of the Reign of His late Majesty King George the Second, intituled An Act for draining and preserving certain Fen Lands in the Isle of Ely and County of Norfolk, lying between the Hundred Foot River and the Ouze, and bounded on the South by the Hard Lands of Mepall, Wicham, Wentworth, Wickford, Ely, Downham, and Littleport, and for empowering the Governor, Bailiffs,

and Commonalty of the Company of Conservators of the Great Level of the Fens, commonly called Bedford Level, to sell certain Lands lying within the Limits aforesaid, commonly called Invested Lands.

An Act for continuing for Twenty-one Years, and from thence to the End of the then next Session of Parliament, the Term, and altering and enlarging the Powers of Two Acts passed in the Thirty-first Year of the Reign of His late Majesty King George the Second, and in the Nineteenth Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, for repairing and widening the Road from the Swan-Inn at Leatherhead, to the Maypole at the Upper End of Spital, or Somerset-Street, in the Parish of Stoke, near the Town of Guildford, in the County of Surrey.

An Act for continuing for Twenty-one Years, and from thence to the End of the then next Session of Parliament, the Term, and altering and enlarging the Powers of Two Acts passed in the Thirty-first Year of the Reign of His late Majesty King George the Second, and the Tenth Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, for repairing several Roads in the Counties of Dorset and Devon, leading to and through the Borough of Lyme Regis, and from the Turnpike-Road on Uplyme-Hill, to the Turnpike-Road at the Three Ashes in the Parish of Crewkerne, in the County of Somerset, and other Roads therein mentioned.

An Act for continuing for Twenty-one Years, and from thence to the End of the then next Session of Parliament, the Term, and altering and enlarging the Powers of Two Acts made in the Twentieth Year of the Reign of his late Majesty King George the Second, and the Twentieth Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, so far as the same relate to repairing and widening the Road from the Borough of Ripon, by Ingram Bank to the Town of Pateley Bridge in the County of York.

An Act for continuing for Twenty-one Years, and from thence to the End of the then next Session of Parliament, the Term, and altering and enlarging the Powers of an Act passed in the Twenty-first Year of the Reign of his present Majesty, intituled An Act for more effectually repairing the Road leading from the Town of Denbigh to the Town of Saint Asaph, and from thence to the Town and Port of Ruthland in the Counties of Denbigh and Flint, and for repealing an Act made in the Thirty-second Year of his late Majesty King George the Second, so far as the same relates to the said Road.

An Act for continuing for Twenty-one Years, and from thence to the End of the then next Session of Parliament, the Term and altering the Powers of Two Acts passed in the Thirtieth Year of the Reign of His late Majesty King George the Second, and in the Nineteenth Year of the Reign of His present Majesty for amending, widening, and keeping in Repair several Roads therein mentioned so far as the said Acts relate to the Road leading from the Town of Wrexham, in the County of Denbigh to Pentre-Brigge, in the County of Flint. *Extract of a Letter from Captain Durham, Commander of His Majesty's Ship Anson, to Ewan Nepean, Esq; dated, at Sea, the 30th April 1800.*

I Beg you will be pleased to inform the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, that on the 27th Instant I captured the Brig Le Vainqueur Letter of Marque, pierced for Sixteen Guns, mounting only Four, from Bourdeaux bound to St. Domingo, with a mixed Cargo of Merchandize.

I have the further Satisfaction to inform their Lordships, that Yesterday, at Daylight, I had the good Fortune to fall in with the Privateers named in the Margin\*. As soon as they discovered me to be an English Man of War, they dispersed in different Directions; I gave Chace to the Brave, being the largest; and in crossing upon opposite Tacks, I gave her a Broadside, which I have reason to believe did her considerable Damage in the Hull; finding she very much outfailed us by the Wind, which she still continued to keep, there being no chance of coming up with her, I bore up and gave Chace to one of those to Leeward, which I captured: she proved to be Le Hardi, of Eighteen Guns and One Hundred and Ninety-four Men; a very fine new Ship just off the Stocks.

I have also sent in, for Adjudication, a very valuable Ship, from Batavia bound to Hamburgh, with the Governor of Batavia on board.
